Here are a few suggestions to make summertime safer in your backyard:

• If you're doing any work around the yard, tidy up as soon as you've finished. Unless yard. you're actually using and keeping an eye on things like garden tools, lawn and plant chemicals, power tools, a ladder, barbecue lighter fluid and matches, put them safely out of harm's way.

 For outdoor entertaining, use unbreakable plastic or heavy paper plates and cups to pre-tion. vent broken glass from findings it's way into the lawn. Don't leave empty bottles lying

 Children and adults can avoid painful cuts, stings and scraped by wearing sandals or light rubber shoes whenever they're outside. And everyone, but particularly babies and young children, should be well protected from the sun's harmful rays. Wear a hat, and slap on plenty of sunscreen.

• Never leave small children unattended, even for a minute. It takes less time than that for accidents to happen. Your children should also knew never to leave the yard, even to retrieve a fly away frisbee without letting you know what they're doing.

 Keep a well-stocked first-aid kit on hand to heal with minor injuries. With gardens containing so many potentially poisonous plants, it's wise to know the number of your local poison control centre just in case your child

swallows anything that might be dangerous.

· Treat barbecues with care. Make sure they're always supervised, particularly if there are children and pets playing around the

· Don't drink excessively while you're sitting out in the sunshine. Too many beers on a sunny afternoon can make you less attentive where children are concerned, and slower to react to any emergency. Alcohol and swimming pools are always a dangerous combina-
