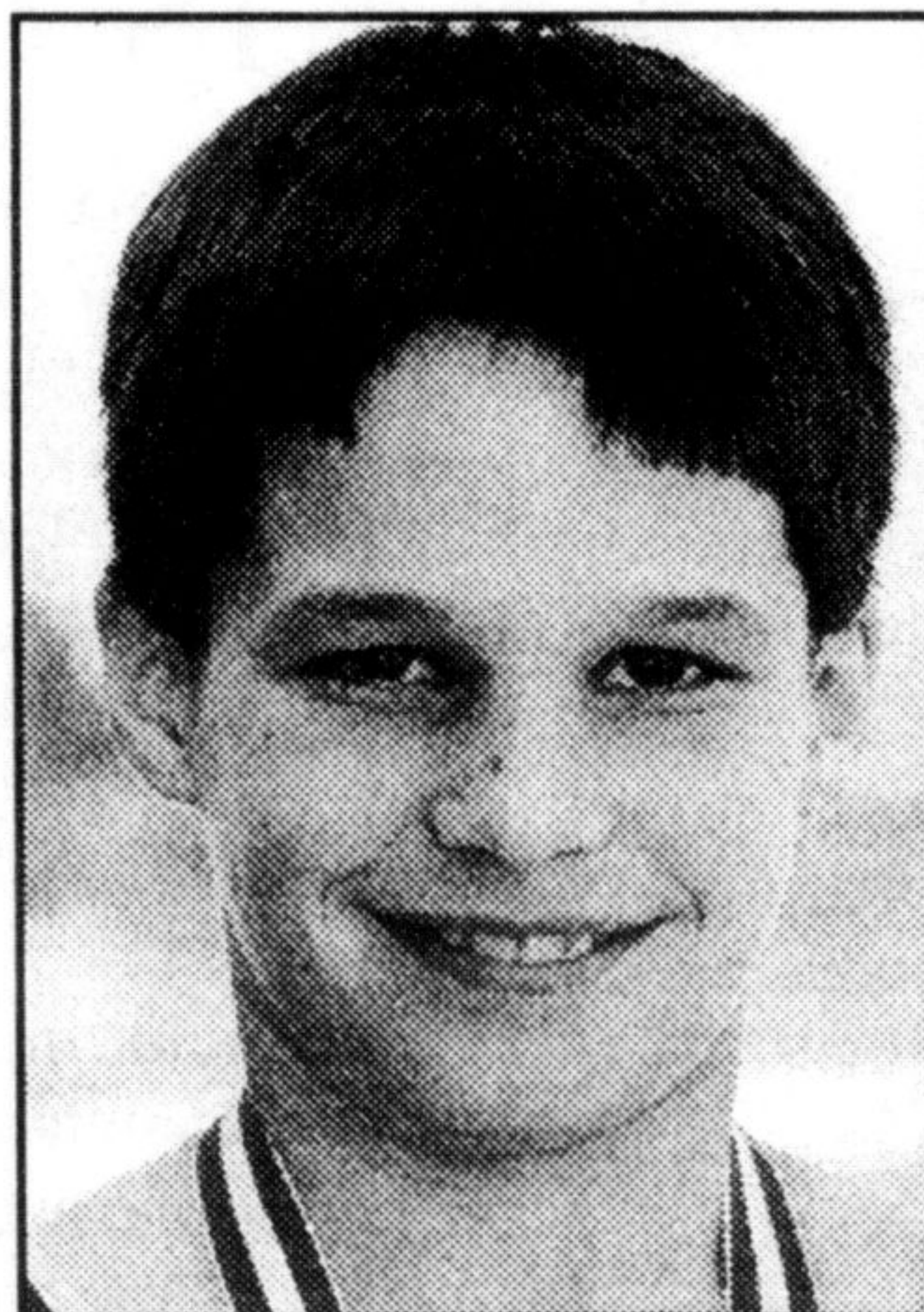
from-behind victory over rival Ben McAuley of London.
