

More vandalism at school

Robert Baldwin School was hit with two more acts of vandalism recently. Two large windows were smashed in two separate incidents occurring between May 7 and 10 at the school, which has been vandalized six times in the last month.

Two classrooms at the Wilson Drive and Woodward Avenue School were damaged during the most recent attacks for a loss of \$500, said Det. Sgt. Jackie Gordon of Halton Regional Police. Police are anxious to speak with anyone with information on the incidents.

Schools damaged

A sign was damaged between the hours of 3-9 p.m. at Bishop Reding School during a May 10 incident. Locks of the 1600 Main St. E. school were damaged and the contents of the sign changed during the incident.

Also, a purple BMX bike was thrown through an east side window during an incident at Holy Rosary School, 141 Main St. E.

Equipment recovered

Two 17-year-old Milton youths have been charged in connection with an April 2 break-in at Milton District High School. A Kipps apparatus was stolen from the science department of the Williams Ave. school during the incident.

One youth faces charges of break and entry, theft and obstructing a peace officer. A second youth faces

charges of break and entry and theft.

Both youths will appear in court June 19. The stolen property has been recovered.

Impaired charges laid

A 40-year-old Brampton man has been charged with impaired driving after being stopped by police at Derry Rd. and Eighth Line in Milton.

The man was found with .80 mg of alcohol in his blood, said Det. Sgt. Gordon. A court date has been set for July 22.

Churches targeted

A stereo, television set and CD player were stolen after an overnight entry of a Trafalgar Rd. church. A back door of Hillcrest Church was pried, then kicked open during the May 11 incident.

Five other Halton Hills churches were entered that night. Police said the incidents are likely related.

Jewelry stolen

Jewelry and a camera were stolen from a Barton St. residence in Milton after a May 6 break-in.

The house was entered through a rear patio door.

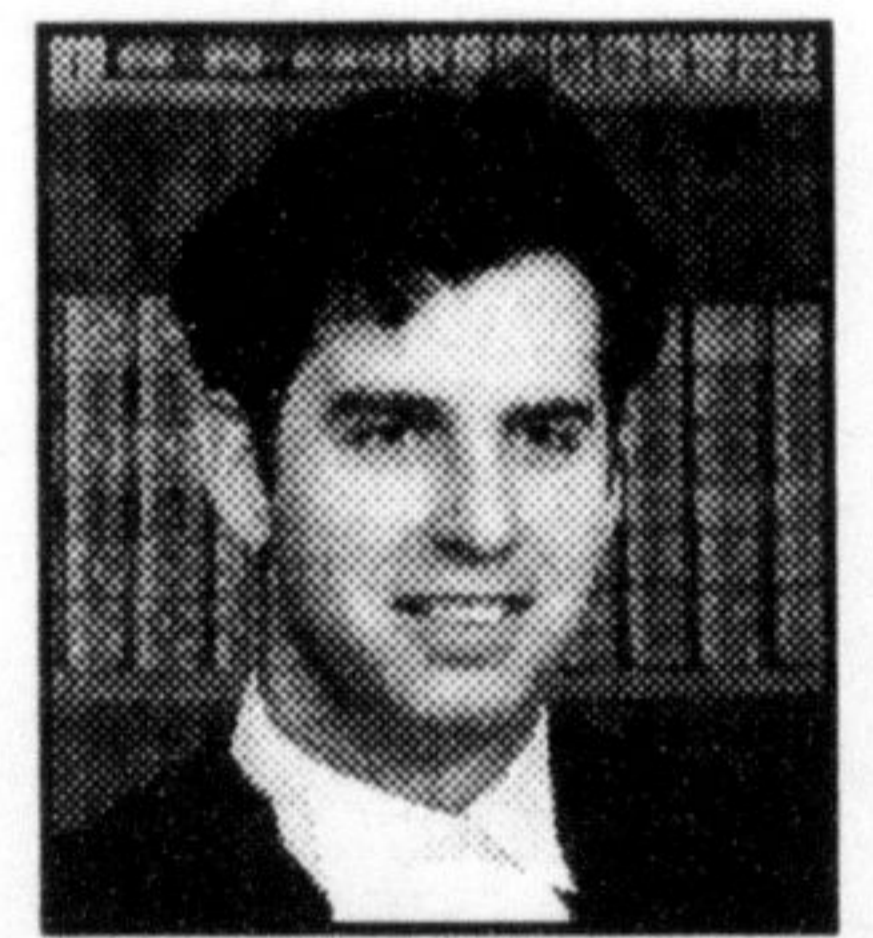

They're shooting for the moon again at Zellers.

The Milton store is organizing its annual Moonwalk for Cystic Fibrosis research. The 10 kilometre trek takes place Sunday, May 24, beginning from the Milton Mall store at 8 a.m.

Those wishing to take part are asked to pick up pledge sheets from the service desk at the store prior to the day of the walk. Zellers is sponsoring a free barbecue for all walkers after the event.

The Moonwalk is so named because the goal is to have walkers pace the equivalent distance to the moon — approximately 240,000 miles — through a combined effort of strollers at more than 300 Zellers

stores.

The event has been going on for 12 years and participants have raised more than \$11.8 million to fight Cystic Fibrosis, a genetic respiratory ailment that kills more young Canadians than any other inherited disease.

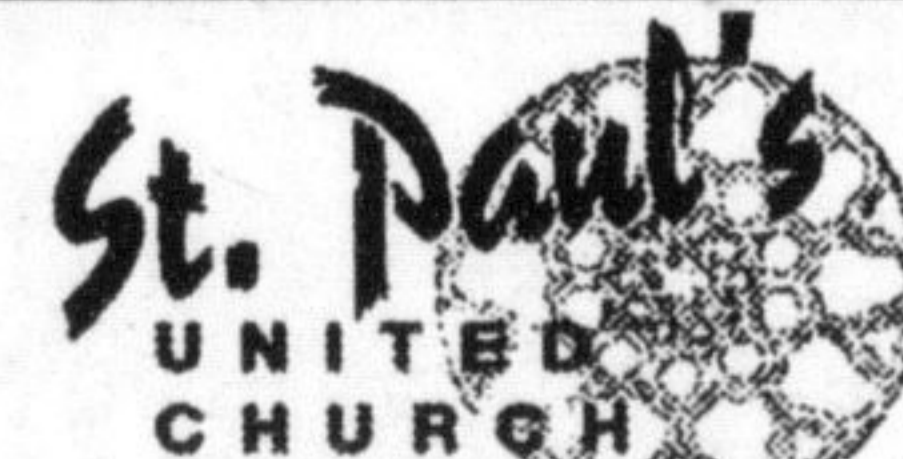
