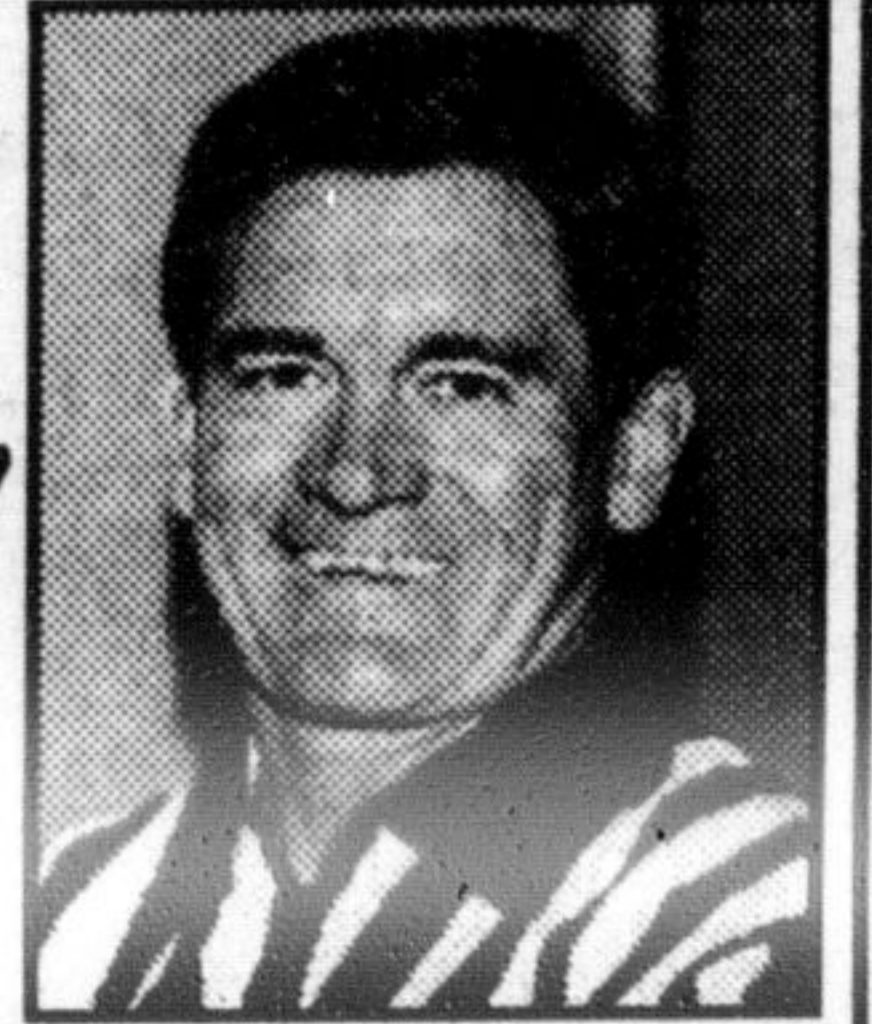

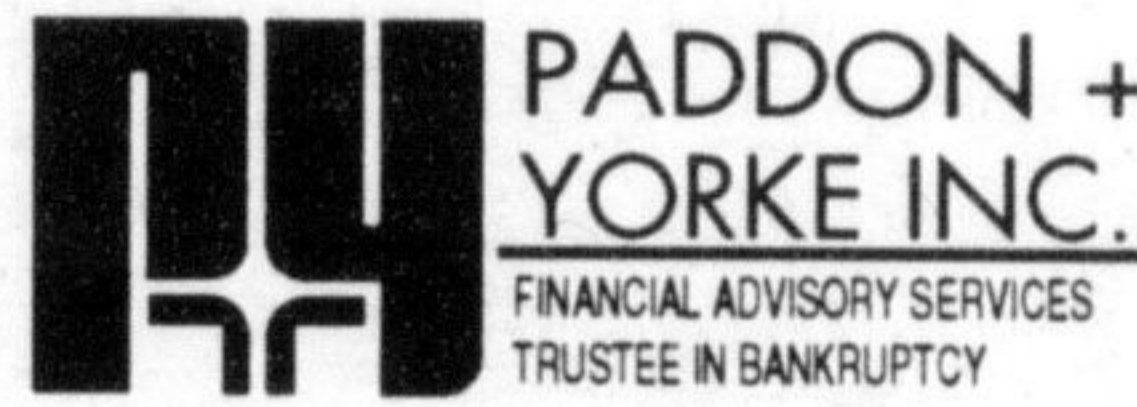

The Canadian Food Inspection Agency is warning consumers with an allergy to peanuts not to eat Unique Bakery's Fudge Nut Brownies sold in individually-wrapped, 130 gram packages.

The product may be topped with crushed peanuts which can cause a serious or life-threatening reaction in persons with a peanut allergy.

The product is now being recalled because the brownies contain peanuts rather than walnuts as stated on the label.
