straw that broke the camel's back.


Perrott gave full marks to Waterdown for battling back but added that the game was one his troops would surely have won - and won decisively — under different circumstances.

He said, "Maybe in the long run it'll be good for the team, that they tasted some humble pie early in the season. They were getting a little comfortable


with the lead we had Tuesday."
