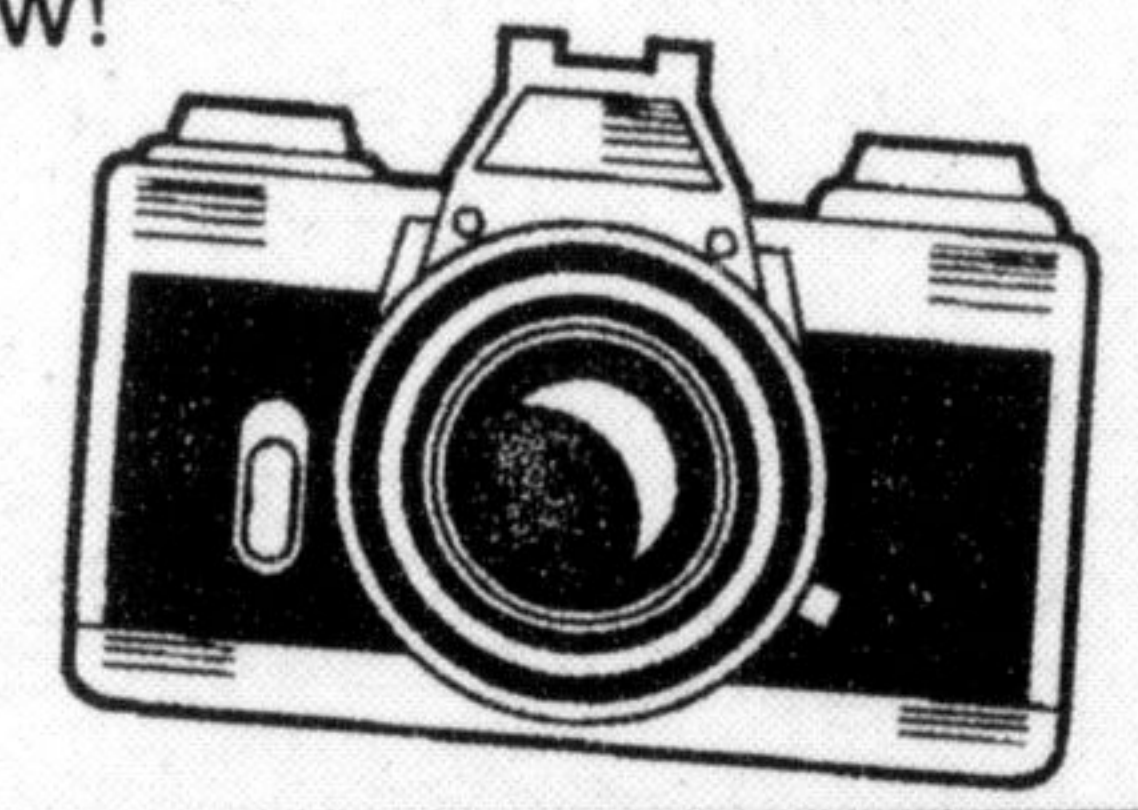
**Benny's Famous Deli**
