Barnes beats the heat

Harry Barnes is once again feeding off adversity and having his fill of success.

The Campbellville athlete needed just 3:13.48 to complete a grueling 2-kilometre swim, 55km bike, 15km run triathlon in Muskoka Sunday.

He finished head and shoulders above his age-class rivals and knocked almost nine minutes off last year's finish — despite racing in sweltering conditions that have been known to play havoc with his fat-free body.

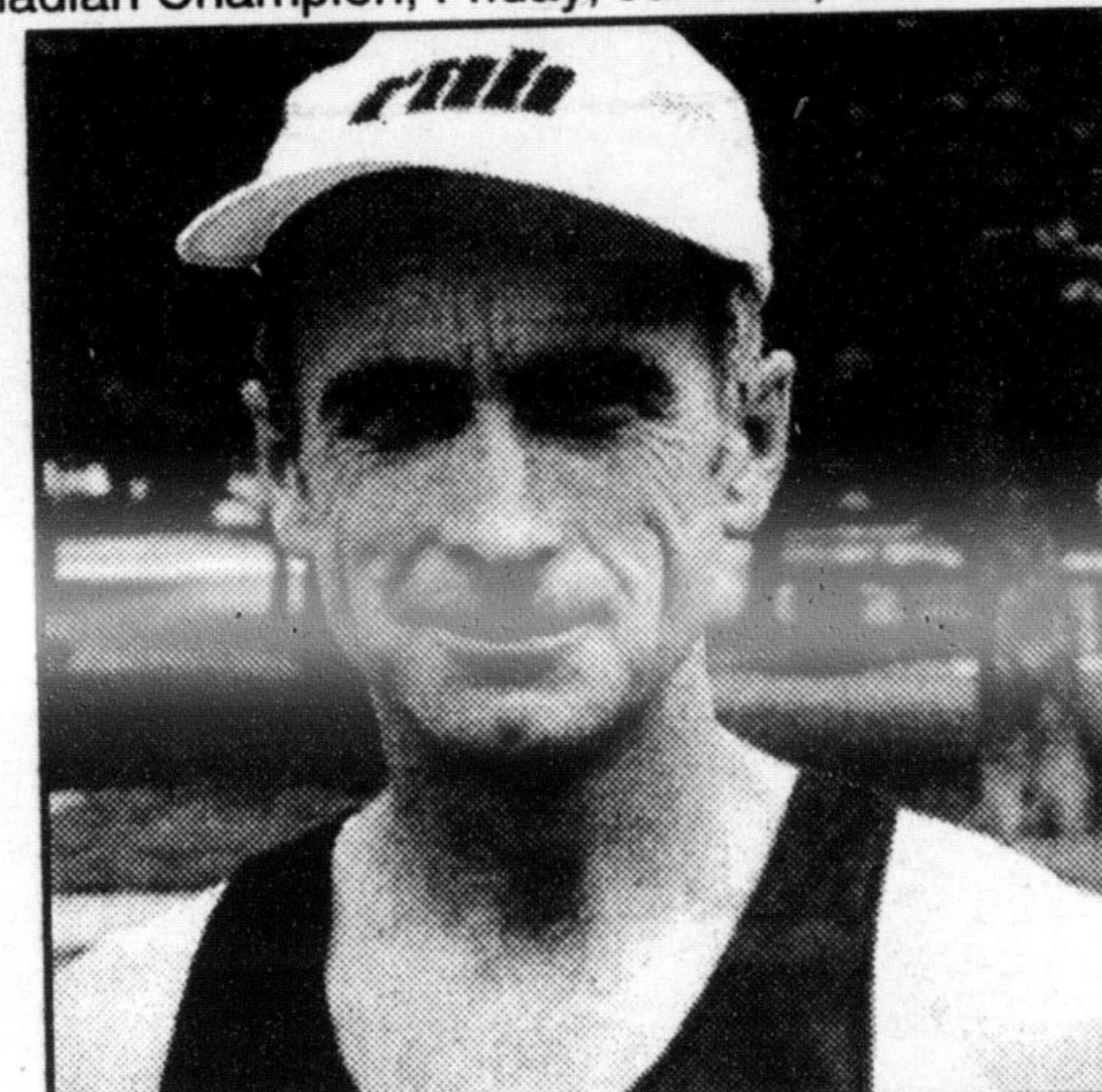
"That might have been the hottest I've ever raced in. It was total survival out there," said the 51-year-old, whose improvement were especially noticeable during the competition's swim portion.

The race served as a qualifier for this summer's World Ironman Championships in Hawaii. Although eligible to compete,

Barnes said he has no interest in making the trip.

Barnes has now won six of seven races on the President's Choice Triathlon Series this season. Earlier this month he was the top finisher in his age group at the Canadian Duathlon Championships in Oshawa, which followed a provincial victory in May.

The highly decorated racer will try to complete a national-level sweep this Sunday in Guelph at the Canadian Triathlon Championships.

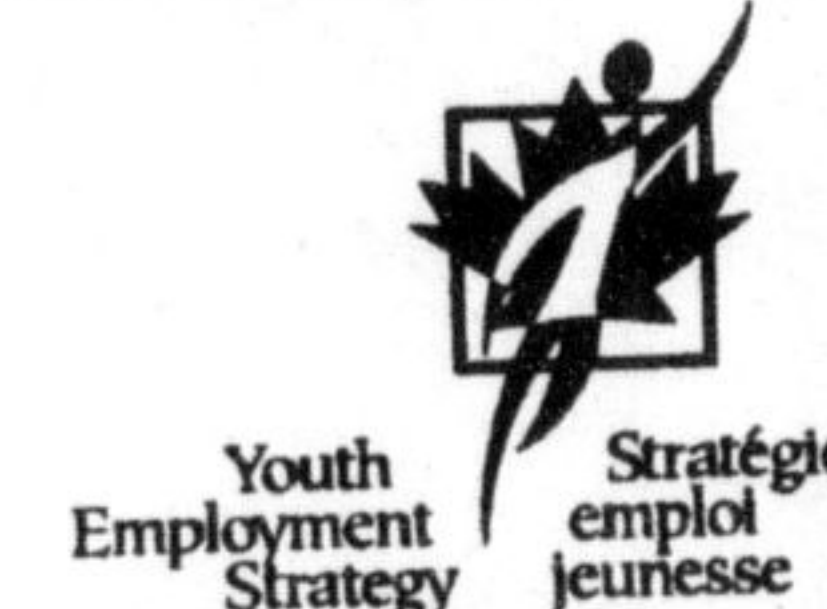
