"I'm disappointed to see that teachers are having trouble with a schedule that is the average in Canada," said Mr. Chudleigh.

"Other provinces find the time to support their extra-curricular activities."

Mr. Chudleigh says it's possible that teachers may be concerned with the speedy pace of reform rather than it's content.

"I think all teachers are concerned about the speed the new curriculum is being implemented but for every day or week or month we delay, we're putting more kids through who are not receiving the best education," he said.

"I think the average teacher will be happy to teach a student who can read and write."

He said it is up to the school board, not the government, to decide how to run school sports programs.

"I don't run the school board," said Mr. Chudleigh. "The school boards do."


Halton Centre MPP Terence Young has reintroduced a Private Member's Bill that would give principals and teachers more power in dealing with substance abuse.
