Man killed in accident

A 5:20 p.m. crash on Trafalgar Road north of Britannia Road Thursday claimed the life of a 20-year-old Limehouse man.

Joe Nincevic was pronounced dead at the scene after his vehicle, northbound on Trafalgar Road, crossed the centre line and struck a southbound van head-on, police said.

The driver of the van, Antonietta Piscicella, 44, of Oakville was taken to Milton District Hospital and admitted with injuries described as non-life threatening.

No passengers were in either vehicle.

The accident is under investigation by the Halton Regional Police's public safety



He's tired of violators who hog disabled parking spots

A Milton man is willing to put his money where his mouth is in an attempt to keep the wrong people out of handicapped parking spaces.

Cliff Bignell of Elliot Crescent says he's tired of physically fit drivers taking up parking spots designated for the disabled.

He says he's seen it happen many times at Milton Mall, and more disturbingly, to a good friend who's disabled.

"He had to go to a regular parking spot and struggled to get in and out of his car," he

"That's not fair. I don't know what the answer to it is. I think it has to be a community effort."

he has told The Champion he will personally fund a student's wages for a couple of weeks to take pictures of violators and their licence plates at Milton Mall.

He suggested that the pictures could be sent to government or police as proof of the illegal acts. The penalty is a \$50 fine.


Help needed

Mr. Bignell said he has seen non-handicapped people simply park their cars in designated disabled spots out of convenience. The vehicles are not labelled with a handicapped sticker qualifying them to park there.

As well, he said he has seen cars that do have the appropriate label park in the spots, but the driver isn't disabled. He guessed the violator could be a handicapped person's family member using the vehicle.
