Escarpment group publishes how-to book

he fight against improper development of the Niagara Escarpment just got a new

A book compiled by The Coalition on the Niagara Escarpment (CONE) is now available as a one-stop information guide aimed at putting protection of the escarpment into the hands of ordinary citizens.

The 100-page book combines illustrations of the breathtaking natural features of the escarpment with information designed to make it easy for anyone to don the cape of environmental protector.

"If you wake up one morning and find there's a quarry in your backyard, the book will give you a guide as to who to call," explained Kyle Ferguson of CONE. "It will also give you the number of folks like us working on the same kind of issues, since there's strength in numbers."

The aim is to stop inappropriate development on the escarpment. That can be anything from quarries to housing complexes to golf courses.

The Southern Ontario portion of the Niagara Escarpment runs from Niagara Falls to the Bruce Peninsula, a 725-km. stretch. For the past 25-years it has been protected by special provincial legislation. It has also been named a World Biosphere Reserve by the United Nations.

Even so, CONE believes that the escarp-

ment is best served by citizens getting in on the act.

"This gives people the resources they need if they're concerned about something," said Mr. Ferguson. "They should know that protection is there,"

CONE itself is an umbrella group of 16-Ontario environmental and community organizations. It formed 20-years ago as a watchdog of the Niagara Escarpment Commission, which is itself meant to be a watchdog of the escarpment.

"We're here to make sure the commission follows it's own mandate, which is to allow only appropriate development of the escarpment," said Mr. Ferguson.

To that end, the book provides a thorough rundown of just what laws are there protecting the environment and what the average person can do to ensure they are

"The purpose isn't to make money on this. CONE has some concern about the general political sphere," said Mr. Ferguson. "We're concerned that the government really be concerned about inappropriate development."

To make their message loud and clear, "It's one-stop shopping if people have a CONE has sent its book to politicians John Snobelen, who is responsible for the escarpment.

Free copies are also being sent to libraries, schools and community organizations along the escarpment.

Skateboarding fundraiser Saturday


BMX and skateboarding demonstrations don't usually go hand in hand with garage sales but they will Saturday at the E.C. Drury High School complex.
