# New Tiger takes to WWF stage

"With me it's much more authentic. grew up in a lavish lifestyle and am tailormade from head to toe," Tiger boasts.

A somewhat more humble Hans says he loves playing a villain — and antagonizing the crowds — again offering credit to WWF producers who have molded raw talent into a more complete package.

"The Asian royalty angle was 100 per cent their (the WWF's) idea," he admits. 'I'm so appreciative to be given the opportunity to do some styling and profiling."

Tiger wasn't able to do much of either Saturday night during his return to SkyDome. In fact he was fortunate just to

veteran grappler Scorpio.

Midway through the bout — number two on the card — he was tattooed by a spinning kick (with much greater impact than usual) that rendered him unconscious for a good 10 seconds.

Recalled Hans, "Once I came to I was slow getting up and a little scared."

Somewhat groggy after that, Tiger was less than spectacular through the late stages of the match and needed an ill-timed top rope fall by Scorpio to score the pin.

He was taken to the hospital for observation immediately following his bout and diagnosed with a mild concussion.

WWF officials were wary about letting him wrestle the following night in walk away from his undercard match with Montreal but eventually gave the green

light and got a far more impressive performance from their newest villain.

Hans, who spent the early part of this week resting up for a three-week swing through western Canada and the United States, credits his newly polished in-ring repertoire to legends like Dory Funk Jr. and Pat Patterson, who offered their expertise during two training camps he attended over the winter and spring.

Crisper drop-kicks and suplexes were among the weapons he used on the weekend. His new mean streak even extended to surprisingly amusing attacks on the federation's light heavyweight champ Taka Michinoku — who wasn't getting much fan reaction either until he too turned heel Monday.

But with his new arrogance, Tiger isn't too worried about competing with Taka for the fans' boos and jeers.

"If all goes well, Tiger Ali Singh is going to be the biggest and baddest heel of them all," he said.

Tiger was one of several wrestlers featured on TSN's Off The Record Friday, when the WWF announced a new fiveyear prime time deal to deliver 'Raw is War' on TSN.

# Chiefs get sweep over the Leafs

The Chiefs are once again the top dogs in local ball hockey.

They swept a best-of-three series against the Leafs to repeat as Milton Ball Hockey League champions.

Also potting a pair was Adam Bertoli, who stood tall defensively with blueline partner Jeff Haydar. The Chiefs' other marksmen were Jeff Currie and Doug Janjevich, while Mark David and Tim McDonald replied for the Leafs.

Fab Giannuzzi faced an onslaught in the Leafs' cage throughout the contest and kept his team within striking distance until the late stages of play.

#### Bewley in top form

Counterpart Steve Bewley was flawless through game one of the series last week and delivered a 4-0 win for his mates.

'Mini' was out for this one — having just had his wisdom teeth removed earlier in the day — while Riggin earned a midgame ejection for his overly aggressive tactics.

Scoring for the Chiefs were Currie, Janjevich, Ian Davidson and Mark McPhail.

Rick Warren turned in a feisty two-way performance for the victors.

Also contributing to the championship repeat were Scott Bertoli, Chris Mutcheson, Trevor Kuhn and Mark Ollerenshaw.

The Chiefs will now take on top teams from Oakville, Burlington and Ottawa in the league's first annual Regional Championship — scheduled for August 15 and 16 at Tonelli Arena.




