


### Little progress in case after fourth appearance

Mr. Deoni, 59, of Steeles Avenue, who faces a fraud charge, was remanded to October 5 in Ontario Court (provincial division) in Milton to set a trial date.

Acclaimed last fall to the position of Milton

school trustee (English) for the Halton Catholic District School Board, Mr. Deoni was charged in March with fraud over \$5,000.

The charge alleges that Mr. Deoni took approximately \$43,000 from Industrial Ceramics Ltd. on Nipissing Road, where he worked on contract as a bookkeeper from 1992 to 1997.

Monday's appearance was the often outspoken school trustee's fourth trip to court since being charged.
