Performers will also wow the crowd individually. According to Ms Kerr, the Police Chorus' 21 members (serving officers and civilians) will be featured in two sets. The first includes police-related songs, says Ms Kerr. One highlight of the second will be "One Small Step and Then the Heart Will Go On." The Chorus --which will perform the evening's anthems - will also team up with the Pipe band and Teen Tour Band for Amazing Grace.

The Halton Regional Police Pipe Band - which started 11 years ago and includes members from all walks of life - will play a variety of Celtic tunes during the mass performances, plus music from its own repertoire during solo portions.

One highlight of the evening is sure to be the Naval Gun Run Team. During the Boer War (1899-1902) huge British naval guns were disassembled and removed from fixed mounts on ships, then transported to shore by ropes, pulleys and plenty of sweat.

This precision naval unit will recreate the incredible task using a 900 kg. replica field piece (circa 1812) which they will haul in pieces across a nine metre "chasm" symbolizing the gap from ship to shore. The gun will then be fired and hauled
