### Reed: Feds in the driver's Your tax dollars will pay seat over the Ouebec issue

anada's future with regard to the Quebec question is unfolding as it should, according to Halton North MP Julian Reed.

"The Supreme Court said what we already believed, however, we wanted a legal confirmation," said Mr. Reed, on holiday in the Maritimes. "Now the Prime Minister has begun to define the political questions."

Among other things, the Supreme Court decision gave Quebec the right to have a separation referendum. However the court also said the actual question and determination of the necessary majority required to allow such a fundamental change to the country would have to be political decisions.

Mr. Reed said the more these political questions are defined the further away from a referendum Canada will get. He agreed that the best thing for the country is to completely remove the potential for a referen-


Prime Minister Jean Chretien has started to frame the questions by making reference to what qualifies as a sufficient majority to trigger negotiations for separation.

Speaking to reporters recently he referred to several formulas, suggesting a two-thirds majority is often reserved for serious decisions such as electing a pope, or amending the U.S. Constitution.

held to the view that the required majority is simply 50 per cent plus one.

He told reporters after the supreme court decision that the judgment contains a paragraph suggesting majority requirements for getting out of the country should be the same as necessary for getting in. In the case of Newfoundland, only 52 per cent favoured joining Canada.

"Even Mr. (Jean) Charest, who supported 50 per cent plus one for his own reasons, agreed that it would be a terrible position to begin a separation negotiation," said Mr. Reed. "Such a split would leave no

place to go."

Mr. Reed said the federal government's stance is that any question needs to be simple and clear.

He added that Mr. Bouchard is not on particularly sound footing to make an election call but is putting his spin on the ruling, which endorses negotiation in the event of a referendum favouring separation.

Mr. Reed chastised the Quebec premier, who suggested he hoped Canada would continue to respect the rights of French speaking Canadians outside the province of Quebec. Mr. Reed countered, saying Canada has always respected minority rights and Mr. Bouchard should respect minority rights in Quebec.

"Mr. Bouchard said he would not hold a referendum unless he was reasonably assured of winning it," said Mr. Reed, who questioned if there will even be another Quebec referendum.




