## Merchants tie as Blues rally

But for one final moment lady luck would ride the shoulders of Bramalea, who managed to pot the equalizer with just threetenths of a second remaining in regulation time.



Neither side could moun much in overtime and the game ended in a 4-4 stalemate, leaving both teams unbeaten after week three of the season.

Brampton and Newmarket are the other Provincial League clubs that have not yet tasted defeat.

While genuine luck favoured the hometown boys at crunch time, the Merchants were in fact every bit as fortunate to escape the night with a tie.

They were blessed with a garbage goal at 4:36 of the third — when a wide-angle shot by Geoff Schomogyi
