A Milton area franchise became the eighth store of the chain to be broken into in the Greater Toronto Area during September.

The preliminary estimate for the value of the tools was placed at \$10,000.

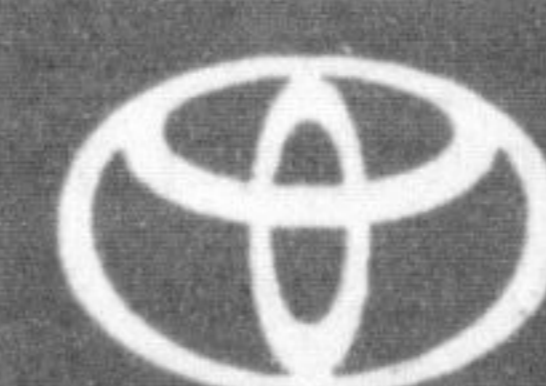
