





Tragic endings may result from play with curtain cords

A recent tragedy in Ontario has underscored the need for parents and caregivers to protect children from strangulation hazards associated with blind and curtain cords.


Since 1984, 15 children have died from strangulation after having wrapped a blind or curtain cord around their necks.

Furthermore, 15 other serious incidents involving

very young children have been reported.

Health Canada recommends keeping cords out of the reach of young children by cutting or tying up the cords or by installing safety devices, which are available at hardware stores or places that sell curtains or blinds.

Additionally, cribs, children's beds and playpens should never be placed near windows or patio doors.
