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


Phase I Urban Expansion Area Milton Secondary Plan/Master Servicing Plan

Town of Milton Phase 1 Urban Expansion Area East/Southeast Secondary Plan (being carried out in accordance with Sections 17 and 21 of the Planning Act and in conformity with the Town of Milton Official Plan), including a Master Servicing Plan (being carried out in accordance with approved procedures contained in the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage and Water Projects)

Location: Area bounded by Highway 401, James Snow Parkway, mid- concession line between 4th and 5th Lines, mid-lot Line between Derry and Britannia Roads, Regional Road 25, Derry Road and Thompson Road in the Town of Milton (See Map Below).

Sixteen Mile Creek Subwatershed Areas 2 & 7 Subwatershed Study (being carried out in accordance with approved procedures contained in the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage and water Projects) Location: See map below



James Snow Parkway Environmental Assessment Study

James Snow Parkway Environmental Study- Highway 401 to proposed Highway 407 (being carried out in accordance with the approved procedures contained in the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Road

Location: Area bounded by Highway 401, a line west of and parallel to 5th Line, proposed Highway 407 and a line to the west of and parallel to 4th Line.

The Town of Milton and the Region of Halton have been involved in the Halton Urban Structure Plan (HUSP) - a strategy for managing Regional and local growth over the next 20 years. In relation to the proposed growth, the Milton Official Plan provides for approximately 2000 hectares (4940 acres) of additional land for new growth which is referred to as the "Urban Expansion Area". Options for phasing this new growth were recently evaluated and the preferred East/Southeast phasing option was ratified by Milton Council and Regional

Council in May and June, 1998 respectively.

In accordance with the policies of the Milton Official Plan and HUSP, the Town of Milton is now proceeding to implement the preferred East/Southeast phasing option through the preparation of a secondary plan and master servicing plan for the East/southeast area, an associated subwatershed plan for subwatershed areas 2 and 7 of the Sixteen Mile Creek watershed, and an environmental assessment for the James Snow Parkway from Highway 401 to proposed Highway 407. The purpose of these studies is a follows:


Secondary Plan/Master Servicing Plan The secondary plan will provide detailed policies on matters such as land use, urban form and design transportation, servicing, including storm water management, and other related issues for the Phase area which will be designed primarily as a residen tial area. As part of the secondary plan process a Master Servicing Plan will be prepared for the Phase 1 area. The Master Servicing Plan is intended to satisfy Phases 1 and 2 and function as a Master Plan as defined by the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage and Water Projects.

ii) Subwatershed Study The Subwatershed Study will provide a general guidance with respect to stormwater and environmental management for Subwatershed Areas 2 and , which include areas beyond the Phase 1 urban Expansion Area. It will also evaluate various stormwater management and servicing strategies for the Secondary Plan area, and will recommend a preferred environmental and stormwater management and servicing plan. The completed study is intended to satisfy Phases 1 and 2 and function as a Master Plan as defined by the Class Environmental Assessment of Municipal Sewage and Water Projects.

iii) Environmentul Assessment Study

The James Snow Parkway Environmental Assessment Study is being undertaken for a proposed extension of James Snow Parkway southerly to future Highway 407. The study will examine opportunities for a continuous arterial road connecting Highway 401 to future Highway 407 to provide the necessary road

capacity for planned growth within the Urban Expansion Area. The proposed roadway would extend from its existing terminus at Main Street East to the future Highway 407 interchange Neyagawa Boulevard in the Town of Oakville and include a crossing of the Sixteen Mile Creek. Upon completion, the study will satisfy Phases 1 through 4 Environmental Assessment Municipal Projects.

Halton Region has a new chief administrative officer.

After a nationwide search, Brent Marshall has been appointed to the position which he has filled on a temporary basis since June.

While Mr. Marshall's swift ascent through regional ranks seemed to begin with a 1997 selection as commissioner of planning and public works, it has in fact been a long journey to the top.

Actually, his overnight success has been 29 years in the making.

From the ground up

It began when Mr. Marshall was a wet-behind-theears 20 year old, working as a labourer for the town of Acton in 1970.

Region of Halton Notice of Public Open House on the Milton Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Class EA Study

November 10, 1998, 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm Open House 7:30 pm Presentation at Bishop Reding Secondary School

The Region currently operates a wastewater treatment plant in central Milton with a rated capacity of 12,900 m3/d. Since June 1997, the Region, in partnership with Zenon Environmental Inc., has operated a demonstration project at the plant to test the innovative membrane bioreactor technology. A key objective of the demonstration project is to determine if the use of the new technology could increase the capacity of the plant without adverse impact to the natural environment.

The Region f Hatton invites you to attend the above noted Public Open House to learn more about the proposed expansion to the Milton Wastewater Treatment Plant. The purpose of the expansion is to accommodate a small amount of growth (an increase of approximately 700 homes or its industrial equivalent) prior to the introduction of the Halton Urban Structure Plan Wastewater Servicing strategy.

The purpose of this public meeting is to outline the preliminary findings of the demonstration project, the results of the water monitoring study and initiate the Class EA process required in order to use this technology to increase the capacity of the plant from 12,900 reguired in order to use this technology to increase the capacity of the plant from 12,900 m3/day to 13,900 m3/day. In addition, to the public open house and public meeting on Tuesday, November 10, 1998, you are invited to attend a meeting held by Council of the Town of Milton to consider the Milton East/Southeast Secondary Plan and related amendments to the Official Plan. The public meeting will be held:

LOCATION:

The Secondary Plan Area is bounded by Highway 401, James Snow Parkway, midconcession line between 4th and 5th Lines. mid-lot line between Derry and Britannia Roads, Regional Road 25, Derry Road and Thompson Road in the Town of Milton. However, the related general Official Plan amendments apply to all the lands in the Town of Milton.

PROPOSAL - Purpose and Effect:

The Town of Milton Official Plan requires the preparation of a secondary plan and its adoption as an amendment to the Official Plan, prior to development of any lands in the Urban Expansion Area. The Milton East/Southeast Secondary Plan will form part of the Official Plan and provides, in more detail than the Official Plan, policies on matters such as land use, urban form and design, transportation, servicing, including stormwater management, and other related issues for this area which will be designed primarily as a residential area.

In addition, as part of the preparation of the Secondary Plan and related studies, a number of amendments to the general Official Plan policies and schedules were identified. These amendments relate primarily to identitying the specific location of the James Snow Parkway, modifying the boundaries of the Urban Expansion Area Planning Districts to reflect the results of the phasing study conducted by the Town and the Region of Halton, updating the planning period date, providing greater direction with respect to setbacks from high pressure gas transmission lines and modifications to the schedules to reflect changes resulting from the Secondary Plan.

PUBLIC MEETING:

PURPOSE: The purpose of the public meeting is to allow you to make representations on the proposed Official Plan amendment, including the

proposed Secondary Plan. ANY PERSON may attend the meeting, and make written or oral submissions on the proposed amendment.
