Hit and run results in impaired charges

A 58-year-old Brampton man faces charges in connection with a hit-and-run accident November 8.

A northbound 1989 Ford Taurus didn't stop after striking a vehicle on Ontario Street at 11:20 p.m., said Det. Sgt. Jackie Gordon of Halton Regional Police.

Police later caught up to the vehicle, which sustained extensive damage, at Steeles Avenue and Ninth Line in Halton Hills.

No one was injured. Charged with impaired driving, driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood and fail to remain at the scene of the accident is a 58-year-old Brampton man.

Tires discarded

Police are investigating the mysterious disposal of 12 tractor-trailer tires on Bell School Line during the early morning hours November 7.
