Post game praise is usually reserved for the victors.

But when an injury plagued underdog wards off a highly anticipated blowout, perhaps recognition shouldn't fall just one way.

Such was the case Thursday at Burlington's Nelson High School in the regional semifinals of senior girls basket-ball.

Refusing to accept their role in a predetermined cakewalk for the provincially ranked Lords, Milton District's lady cagers worked a stall offence to perfection and finished within 15 points of the talent-rich host team.

The 46-31 final was Nelson's slimmest margin of victory this season. It was also the only time they were held below the half century mark.

"I'm so elated you'd think we had won," said Mustangs' head coach Martha Gleeson, whose team closed out the season at 6-3 in league play and 12-8 overall. "I honestly thought we might lose by as much as 50 points, but we really stymied them early on and made it competitive."

MD trailed by only six at the half thanks to a strong passing game that helped eat away at the clock and prevent the hometown girls from breaking out.

While still hindered by a sore ankle, veteran Jen McManus rediscovered her scoring touch — sinking three baskets in the opening quarter and completing the afternoon with 10 total points.

Key players out

She and fellow offensive anchor Anne Gleeson drained field goals in the dying minutes of the game to make the final tally even more respectable for a team that was missing two of its veterans while four others played through minor injuries.

The 'Stangs might have been able to orchestrate a closer ending had it not been for foul trouble early on that forced them to use Gleeson and top gunner Candice Ceelen — who had 10 points — sparingly down the stretch.

This allowed Nelson to outscore them 8-2 in the third quarter and essentially put things out of reach.

Helping shore up defensive efforts was rookie Jessica Simpson while Lisa Brown and Sharalee Dempster grabbed numerous rebounds and combined for six points.

Said Gleeson, "I played everyone and they all did a great job. We're only losing three girls next year so our prospects remain high."

Meanwhile, Nelson moves on to face the M.M. Robinson Rams of Burlington in this afternoon's Halton Championship at Sheridan College.

M.M. Robinson battles Lester B. Pearson in the junior finals.


