





# Improved facility is open

A new facility for Halton and Peel youths in trouble with the law officially opened it doors just north of its former location on Boston Church Road Wednesday.

The recently-built MacMillan Youth Centre replaced the Delwood Program, which was located in a government-rented century house.

The former building's structure limited staff in working with the young residents, said executive director Colin Dart.

"The new facility has made a difference in the programs we want to provide," he said.

The new, open custody/detention centre for youths aged 12 to 15 years houses up to 18 youths already sentenced for criminal acts or awaiting court appearances.


The one-floor bungalow is equipped with a small, indoor gymnasium, while the previous facility only had a modest outdoor basketball court.

The Delwood centre also had three floors, which made it more difficult to supervise, Mr. Dart said.

Construction of the MacMillan Youth Centre named after a former ministry employee who was dedicated to assisting Halton's troubled youths began in September last year and wrapped up in the spring. Following some finishing touches, operation began in the fall.

Owned by the provincial government, the new centre opened with support from the Ministry of Community and Social Services and Community Resource Services, a non-profit organization that provides a range of programs and services for youth and their families.

### Smoking in Public Places By-law - Town of Milton

TAKE NOTICE THAT, pursuant to Section 213 of The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.M.45, as amended, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton, at their meeting held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November, 1998, approved and passed By-law No. 96-98, being a By-law to regulate smoking in Public Places in the Town of

WHEREAS it has been determined that second-hand tobacco smoke (exhaled smoke and smoke from idling cigarettes, cigars and pipes) is a public nuisance because of its irritating and discomforting properties and is a health hazard because of its impairment, adverse effect and risk to health, to the inhabitants of the Town of Milton;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Town of Milton to provide for the regulation of smoking and second-hand smoke for the better protection of persons from conditions injurious to health in accordance with the provisions of this by-law;

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all Milton residents, proprietors, owners and tenants of buildings. or part of a building, structure or portion thereof, as specifically defined and set forth in By-law No. 96-98, including any enclosed indoor area that is opened to the public within the boundaries of the Town of Milton, to ensure conformity with the Smoking in Public Places By-

#### Application of By-law:

This by-law applies to all enclosed public places within the boundaries of the Corporation of the Town of Milton.

**Short Title:** 

This By-law shall be cited as the "Smoking in Public Places By-

#### Scope of By-law:

In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of any act, regulation or other by-law relating to smoking, then the provisions of those acts, regulations or by-laws which are most restricted of smoking shall prevail.

Enclosed Public Place: means any enclosed indoor area that is open to the public and includes but is not limit-

a) those parts of a restaurant, bar, health care facility, child care facility, commercial establishment, shopping mall, education or financial institution, place of worship or other places that are open to clients, customers, patients, students or other members of the public;

b) an elevator, escalator, or corridor in any building to which the public, clients or residents may have access;

- c) a public washroom;
- d) a place of assembly;
- e) a common area of an enclosed
- f) a service line;
- g) a reception area or lobby;
- h) gasoline kiosk;
- i) food court;
- j) lunch counter; k) place of amusement;
- I) taxicab when occupied by pas-
- sengers; m) school bus - when used for the transporting of students to and from school or to and from an activity, event or function associated therewith.

No person shall smoke in any enclosed public places within the Town of Milton unless otherwise permitted by this by-

#### **Proprietors' Duties:**

- (1) Every proprietor shall ensure that "no smoking" signs are conspicuously posted so that the signs are clearly visible in all areas where prohibited under this by-law.
  - \*Any signs referred to in this by-law shall be acquired from the Corporation of the Town of Milton. Alternative signage is permitted; subject to approval from the Town Clerk.
- (2) Where smoking is prohibited under this by-law, a proprietor shall inform any person who is smoking in a prohibited area that smoking in that area is prohibited.
- (3) No proprietor shall permit a person to smoke in a place where smoking is prohibited under this by-law.
- (4) Every proprietor shall ensure that ashtrays and other paraphernalia used in connection with smoking, are not present in areas where smoking is prohibited under this by-law.

#### Enforcement:

An inspector may, at any reasonable time, enter any public place as designated by this by-law for the purpose of determining whether there is compliance with this by-law.

An inspector may make such examinations, investigations and enquiries as are necessary to determine whether there is compliance with the by-law.

#### Obstruction:

No person shall obstruct an inspector carrying out an inspection, examination, investigation or enquiry as are necessary to determine whether there is compliance with the by-law.

#### Penalty for Non Compliance:

Any owner, proprietor or other person who contravenes, permits the contravention of or allows contravention of any provision of this bylaw, is guilty of an offence and upon conviction, pursuant to the Provincial Offences Act, is liable to a penalty of not more than \$5,000, exclusive of costs, for each offence committed.

A copy of By-law No. 96-98 and appropriate signage may be obtained from the Clerk's Office, Town of Milton.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE THAT By-law No. 96-98 shall come into full force and effect three (3) months from the date of its enactment (February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1999).

#### (Two (2) Members Required)

The Town of Milton currently requires two (2) Milton citizen members to serve on the Committee of Adjustment and Consent, which is a newly formed statutory, decision making committee established under the Planning Act to consider minor variances to the Town of Milton's Zoning By-law and land division (severance) applications.

The term of appointment will be for the same term as the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton, expiring on November 30th, 2000.

There will be at least one meeting per month of the Committee of Adjustment and Consent; provided that, in the discretion of the Secretary-Treasurer, there are sufficient applications.

Compensation will be established by Milton Council.
