Police seized more than 400 marijuana plants with an estimated street value of \$43,000 after executing a search warrant at a Guelph Line residence last week.

Drug investigators discovered the plants growing on the second floor of a barn and in a closet of a house, said Det. Scott Mason of Halton Regional Police.

Equipment used in the hydroponic growing operation was also seized, he said.

Because the plants ranged in size from three to eight inches, Det. Mason said he believes the operation had recently started.


