Smokers' turf to be trimmed, again Body found

Smoking just got its butt kicked in Milton.

A strict new anti-smoking bylaw is set to come into effect February 2.

The souped-up bylaw was passed by town council November 2 of last year, but it takes three months for it to come into full force.

Under the new rules, local restaurants will be required to shave their smoking sections to just 30 per cent of total capacity. Bar smoking sections will be limited to 50 per cent.

Outdoor patios are exempt.

The smoking in public places bylaw applies to schools, banks, malls, churches, health care and child care facilities.

In other words, virtually every enclosed place that is available to the public, including cabs, elevators, food courts, public washrooms and gasoline kiosks.

The bylaw that was passionately championed by regional medical officer of health Dr. Robert Nosal will bring Milton in line with similar policies in Oakville and Burlington.

Prior to the bylaw, Milton was second only to Halton Hills in terms of lax lighting laws, allowing smokers up to 70 per cent of restaurant and bar space.

Halton Hills topped the region in smoke tolerance, granting its residents 75 per cent smoking

To stay in compliance with the smoking bylaw,

proprietors must post clearly visible no smoking signs in designated areas.

They are also required to remove matches, ashtrays and other smoking accessories from banned

Lastly, they must inform renegade smokers of the bylaw should they light up in banned areas.

Ignoring the bylaw could burn a hole in the budget, as it carries a fine of up to \$5,000 per offence.

The inspiration for the tougher law stemmed in part from the results of a 1995 survey in which a whopping 79.9 per cent of local respondents supported stricter smoke laws.

It will be enforced by health inspectors, who can enter an establishment at any time to ensure that people are butting out in public.

was killed. "There's going to be a fair amount of investigating before we'll be able to identify the scene for that murder,"
