Halton Championships next month have also been nixed.

Basketball team can't practice

Among others hurt by the fire are the senior boys basketball team, who're currently enjoying one of their most successful seasons but will now be lacking practice time since they'll have to share the one gym with five other squads.

"This wasn't some kind of robbery, but an act of pure vandalism. That's what bugs me the most," fumed senior hoops skipper Kevin Houldcroft.



Also destroyed were basketball nets and championship banners, Captain Cross said.

By the time it's all cleaned up, damage could reach about \$1 million, said Det. Constable Owen Gray, police's north Halton arson investigator.
