

Parents simply fed up

Joanne Slomka is mad, and she's not going to take it anymore.

She's prepared to picket, protest and petition to make sure her voice is heard, and the Burlington woman says there are many more like her in Halton.

Ms Slomka is one of a handful of parents who are the force behind the newly-formed Parent Action Group of Halton Catholic Secondary Students (PAG).

Tuesday night she addressed trustees with the

Halton Catholic District School Board, on behalf of the 150 or so angry parents who have attended PAG meetings.

The parents are angry that the labor dispute between the school board and its 375 high school teachers has dragged on for the last five months, disrupting their children's educations and depriving them of extracurricular activities.

Kate Baker, an OAC student at Burlington's Assumption secondary school, told trustees that the first makeup day at her school was chaotic and disorganized.

While students who had missed class time in the fall were sched-The plan was designed to help uled for special five-hour long lessons in their regularly scheduled classes, said Ms Baker.

> "There's also a lot of misinformation, because nothing's being

announced," she added.

Students don't know which classes they should be in, some classes aren't covered because teachers are teaching special makeup classes and some students don't think they're supposed to be at school at all, Ms Baker said.

"At any given time, there were 200 kids wandering around the halls," she said. "It was a total waste of time."
