From there the Georgetown Raiders provided much stiffer competition but ended up on the short end of the stick as well in a 6-3 decision.

McLeod led offensively with a hat-trick and Clarke worked the cage. Milton's other snipers were Frittenburg, Nick Cashmore and Johnny Labella.
