Single markers were registered by Chris Dumencu, Evan Jeans, Darryl Langstone and Justin Tingley.

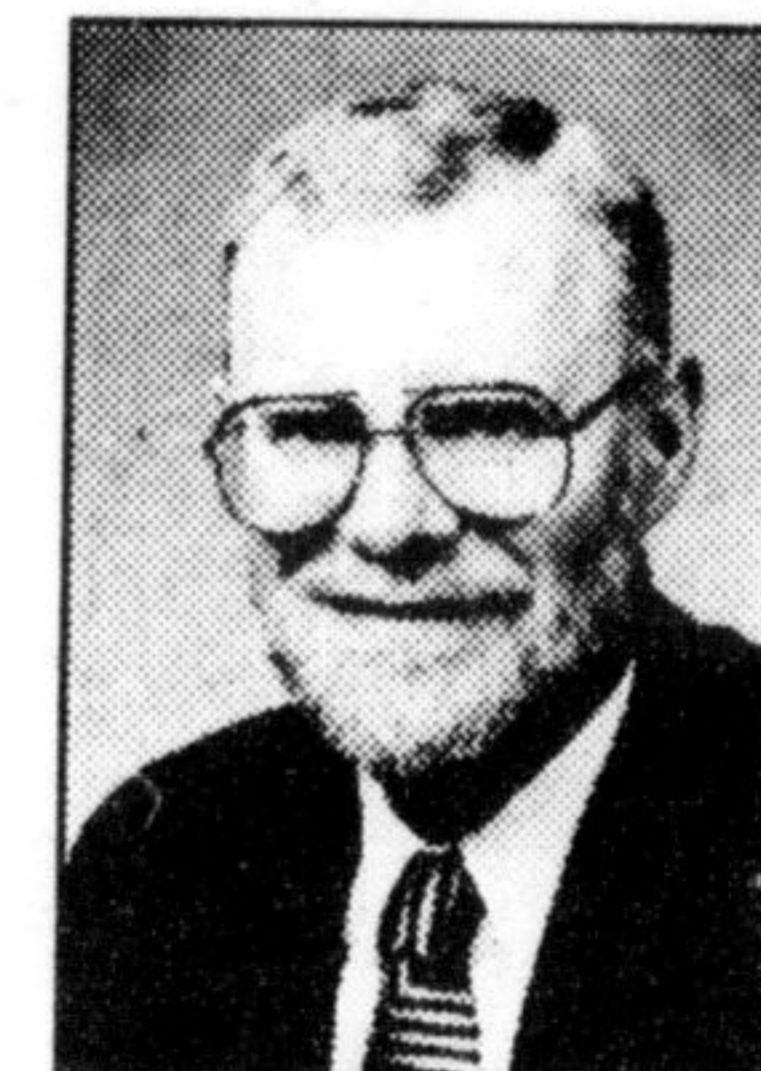

LSF
for your RSP?

For Labour Sponsored Funds (LSF), the rules of the game change each year with each new federal budget. At the moment you may contribute up to \$5,000.00 to an LSF and receive up to a \$1,500.00 tax credit from the federal and provincial governments. You also have to repay the tax credits if you sell the fund within eight years.

THIS IS NOT ABOUT RRSPs!

LSFs were created to provide capital to Canadian companies that are too new, too small, or too risky to get capital from normal capital markets. For many people, the combination of the RRSP tax deduction and tax credit provides a fabulous rate of return on their initial investment. This return is somewhat superficial as the RRSP tax deduction would be there no matter what you invest in. So, what you should look at more closely is the nature of the investments that the LSF makes. Are they consistent with your long-term investment goals? I recommend that if you decide to invest in an LSF, reinvest the tax credit in a lower-risk balanced fund to offset the financial risk.
