

Merchants dominate. sweep the Kilty Bees

The Merchants' century-ending playoff run was sparked by an historic prologue.

Milton took the opening round with unparalleled dominance, giving up a grand total of one goal in a towering three-game sweep of the Hamilton Kilty Bees.

Never before has the local franchise so thoroughly disposed of a postseason opponent. Steeltown's sweethearts needed a perfectly placed slapshot by veteran Brad Gubbins in the middle of Friday's clincher — at a half-filled Memorial Arena — just to prevent an overall blanking.

"I really wasn't thinking about it (a third straight shutout). I'd already gotten more than I had expected for the whole playoffs," said goalie Jeremy Wenzel, who worked the entire round one schedule while partner Daniel Jacques battled the flu.


"I really surprised myself. The defence helped out a lot as well. I saw maybe two or three rebounds all series."

Similar to the preceding tilts, Hamilton was easily deflated in the 8-1 series finale and conceded defeat after falling behind in the first period.

Their lone goal was courtesy of a powerplay — with Ryan Carrigan in the box for holding - and a neutral zone turnover by the Merchants' blueline

With the exception of a few defensive lapses the Merchants owned the Kilty Bees who're now 2-11 versus Milton in playoff history.

Right winger Nathan Gillies said such an authoritative first round victory should do won-

ders for the team, whom he feels are as closely knit as last season's All-Ontario championship contingent.

"The chemistry right now is unbelievable. I'd say we're just as interlocked as last year," the assistant captain remarked.

Friday the Merchants outshot their offensively challenged guests 48-24 and got production from every forward unit.

Geoff Schomogyi kicked off the hit parade 8:14 into the contest by sinking his third powerplay goal in as many games.

Two minutes later workhorse Chad Blundy — usually content to do the thankless tasks like blocking shots and killing penalties — tipped in Matt
