A long-time Red Cross volunteer, along with a native Miltonian who donates her time to numerous causes and an active advocate for Parkinson's disease research represent the three 1998 Citizen of the Year nominees.

Sheilagh Borcsok, Donna Coulter and Lynda McKenzie share a community-minded attitude in their work for different non-profit organizations, say their nominators.

The women also share a feeling of honour for their award nominations.

"I'm a little embarrassed because I'm not accustomed to this type of attention," said Ms Borcsok. "I can't help but feel honoured."

Known for her pleasant personality, Ms Borcsok, 40, has been instrumental in building an efficient Canadian Red Cross Society branch that provides valuable services to the community, said her nominator.

The married mother of three children moved to the area more than 12 years ago, just as the Milton branch opened. She volunteered in public relations for the first four years. Today she serves as president of the branch and leads a babysitting course at Milton Public Library.

The problem of someone entering unlocked apartment units to steal cash has expanded to Milton, and Crime Stoppers hopes someone will help identify the culprit.

On Friday, Mar. 5, a person gained access to two apartment units at 40

In both cases, the units were kept unlocked when someone was home. That is the common thread connecting the thefts with crimes reported in Georgetown and Acton in February.
