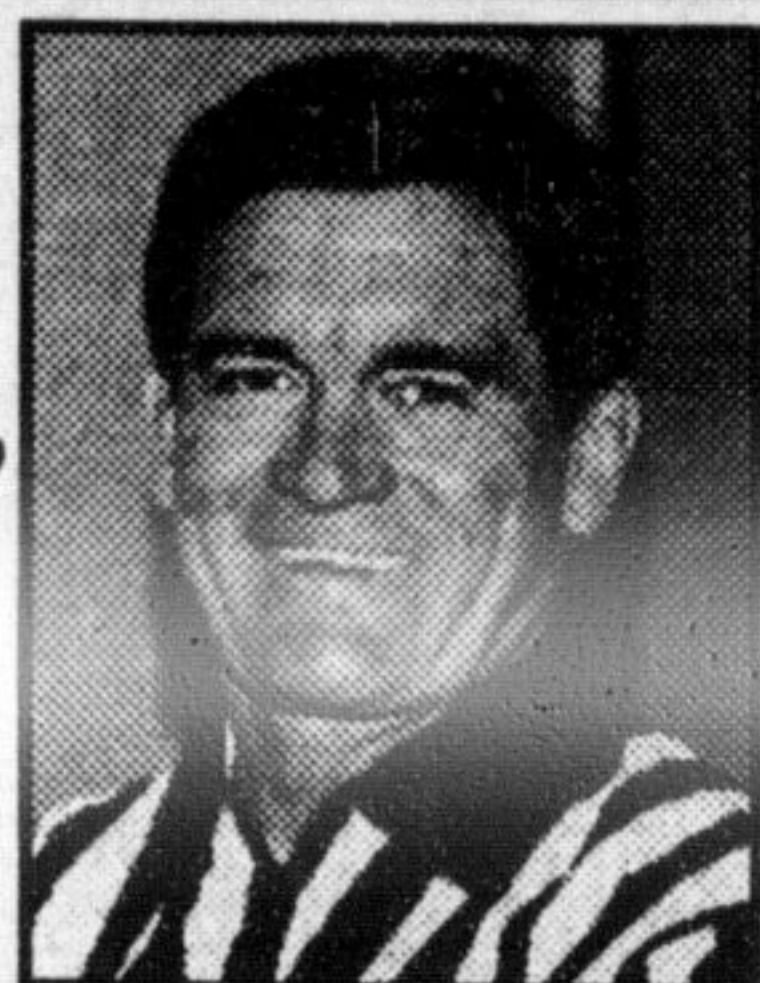

ONTARIO GOVERNMENT NOTICE NAVIGABLE WATERS PROTECTION ACT R.S.C. 1985, CHAPTER N-22

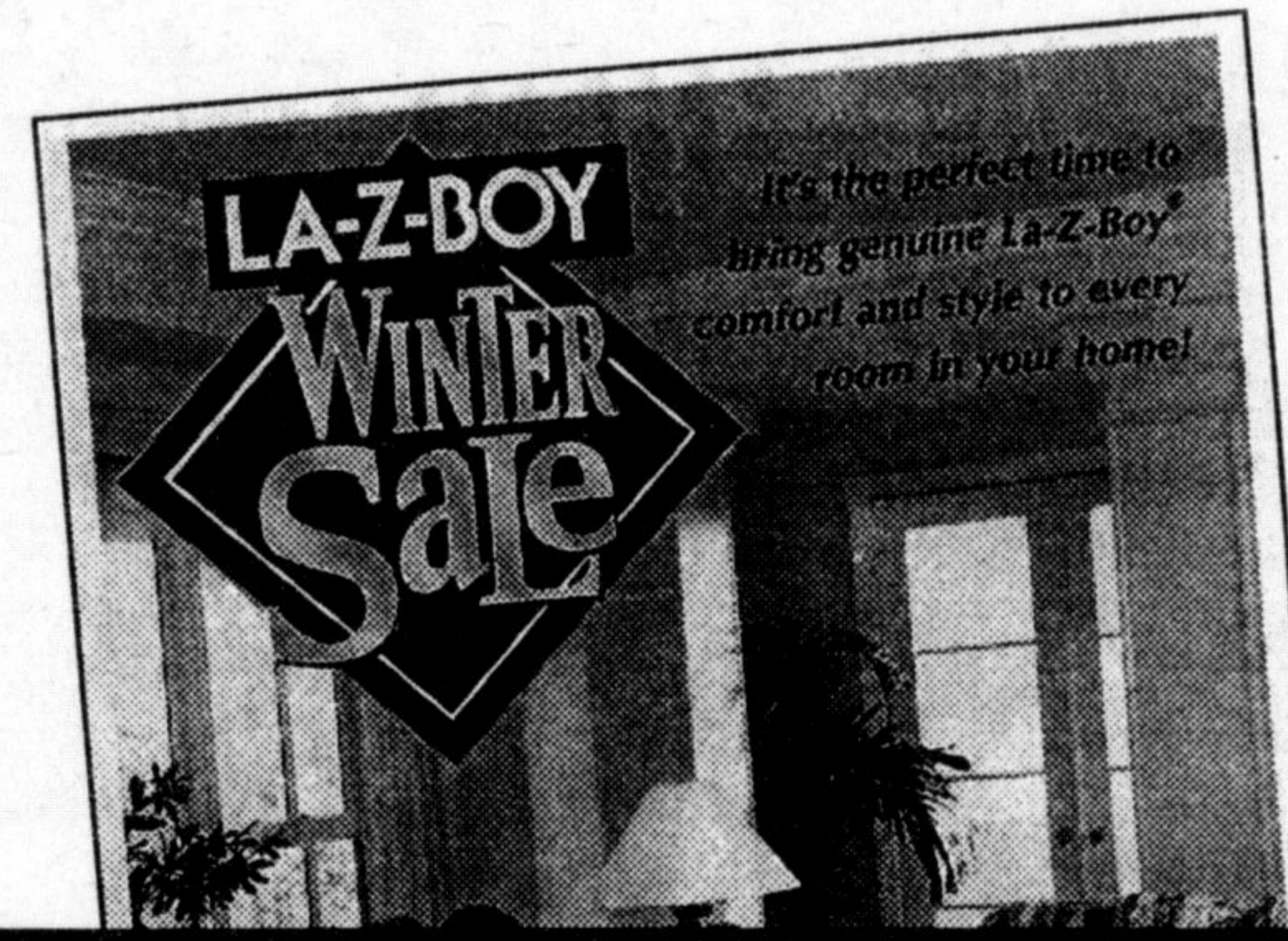

Under Section 9 of the said Act, The Ministry of Transportation, Ontario, has deposited with the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans, and in the office of the District Registrar of the Land Registry District of the Regional Municipality of Halton at The Town of Milton, Ontario under deposit number G-45 a description of the site and plans of a Queen Elizabeth Way Bridge proposed to be rehabilitated over the Bronte Creek & Highway 25 at the Town of Oakville, Township of Trafalgar, Regional Municipality of Halton, in front of lot number 31, Concession 2.

Written objections based on the effect of the work on marine navigation should be directed not later than one month from the date of this notice to: Regional Director, Canadian Coast Guard, Department of Fisheries and Ocean, 201 Front Street North, Suite 703, Sarnia, Ontario, N7T 8B1.
