### Sends UNH to Frozen Four

# Haydar delivers winner in overtime

Darren "Mini" Haydar has been a regular contributor and frequent standout for the University of New Hampshire this season.

Saturday night in Worchester, Maine the electrifying right winger added team hero to his ever-growing portfolio — delivering an overtime winner to defeat Michigan 2-1 and send his Wildcats to the NCAA's Frozen Four in Anaheim.

His timely tally came 3:16 into the extra session. Charging to the right post, the nation's top scoring freshman knocked a loose puck through Michigan goaltender Josh Blackburn's pads and into the far corner.

Assisting on the play was nation points leader Jason Krog, whom Haydar has skated with since the third week of the season.

"Blackburn is a great goalie. You can't expect to put it by him on every shot," said the former Milton Merchants star, who has 30 goals this year.

"I was just lucky to put it by him on that shot."

### Revenge is sweet

Haydar's heroics not only put UNH in the national semifinals for the second time in as many years but served as revenge against the Wolverines — who blanked them 4-0 in last year's Frozen Four semis.

UNH, which led Hockey East in both offence and defence this season, neutralized a Michigan attack that ran roughshod over Denver one night earlier.

The victory was the latest in a series of highlights for the local sharpshooter, who the San Jose Sharks and New York Rangers.

He was recently named Hockey East's Rookie of the Year and was appointed to both Hockey East's All-Rookie Team and Second Team All-Stars.

Haydar finished the regular season with 27 goals and 23 assists in 34 games.

### Merchants heading to finals after semis win

The Merchants' success isn't coming with ease, finesse or even certainty but the fact remains that it is coming.

In a playoff run that has been riddled with attacks of the flu and the constant overshadowing by last champions, year's Marty Williamson's '98/99 charges continue to survive and are now within striking distance of a third straight league title triumph.

Standing in the way of a three-peat is Bramalea, who took the conference crown away from them less than two weeks ago and have yet to lose a home playoff game.
