## Hunter calls for heart machines on fire trucks to help save lives

Lives could be saved by adding defibrillators to Milton fire trucks, says Councillor Wally Hunter.

"I think it is a critical issue if you can save one or two lives," he said.

Mr. Hunter pitched the idea to council just one day before the release of a Canadian study that showed heart attack victims have a far greater chance of survival if emergency vehicles arriving on the scene have defibrillators on board.

The study, carried out by the Loeb Health Research Institute and just published in the Journal of the American Medical Association, tracked 6,000 patients in 19 Ontario communities over four years.

It concluded that patients who suffered a heart attack outside of a hospital had a 30 per cent greater chance of survival when vehicles with defibrillators were dis-

cle arriving in eight minutes or less.

Milton bid for defibrillators, said Fire Chief Harold Penson.

requires that certain response times be met before defibrillators — or small electric shock paddles used on the hearts of patients suffering from cardiac arrest can be added to trucks.

Milton fire department would likely meet the requirement, volunteer night staff

would have a tougher time of it, said Chief Penson.

"At night we're dealing with part-time staff who have to come into the station," he said. "We can't meet that requirement."

The average response time in Milton is 11 minutes. In an urban area, the ideal is closer to four.


Adding more full-time staff is the most likely way to meet the requirement, said Chief Penson.

"The only way around it now is to add full-time people around the clock," he said.


It's possible that Milton's ability to meet required response times in the daylight hours could be enough to swing the Ministry's favour, said Chief Penson.

The issue is even more critical now that Halton Region has decided to go with the status quo in ambulance service, said Mr.
