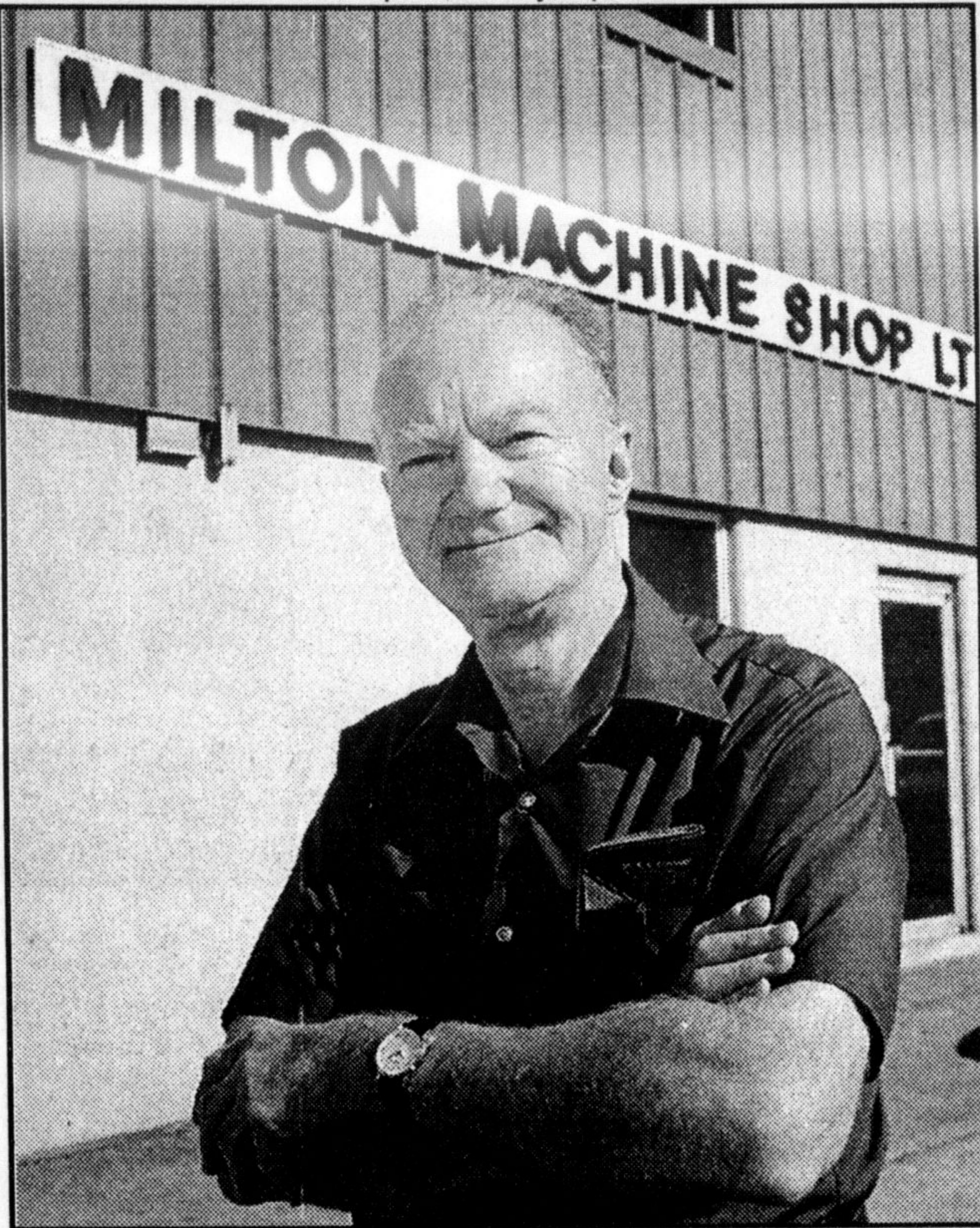

"It's been fantastically received. It's going beyond people's expectations. There's a lot of excitement over this."

Meanwhile on nearby Mill Street, Bill Rowney has spruced up the Milton Machine Shop's dull concrete appearance with steel siding. The renovations included a 7,400 square-foot addition to allow for expanded operations on the west side of the building. The property became available after the Milton Import Car Centre moved to Main Street.

The outer main building was spruced up to match the design of the addition, said Mr. Rowney, who took over the business from his father, Wilfred Rowney, when he passed away in 1952. His father had started the business in 1946.

"It's just something we felt we should do for the esthetic look and civic responsibility," he said.

The small shop, which sponsors sports teams, employs nine full-time workers five days a week, catering to customers from Milton to northern Ontario and northern Quebec.

The general machinist shop that makes tooling for industry also hosts an apprenticeship program in which many participants have won workmanship awards.

The building has undergone several renovations over the years and it won't stop here. Future improvements will see the rear of the building covered with the same design, said Mr. Rowney, a local hydro commissioner.

a rundown Main Street structure demolished to build a bigger and better pharmacy. He opened the new Zak's Pharmacy just a few blocks away from the original store a year ago. It's double in size.

Mr. Patel said he put a lot of forethought into the design of the new building. "We didn't just put up a store. We tried to blend it in with the community."

The new, spacious store features a sliding automatic door for the disabled and the elderly.

The winner of the award will be announced Saturday during the Chamber's gala evening at Granite Ridge Golf Club.

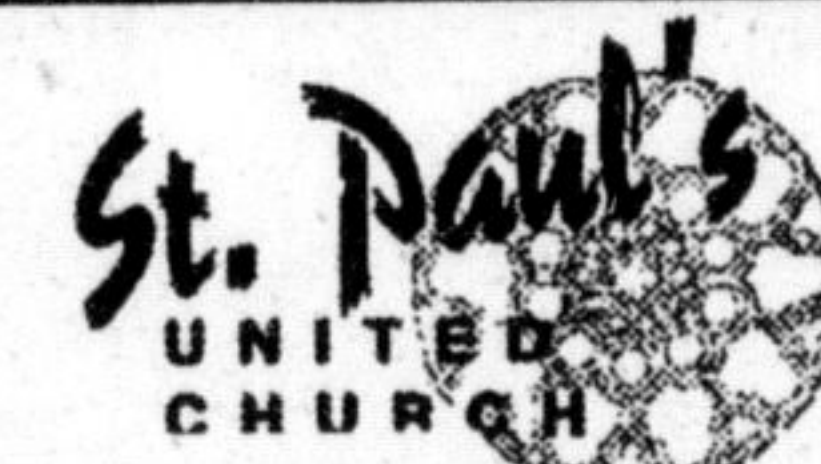

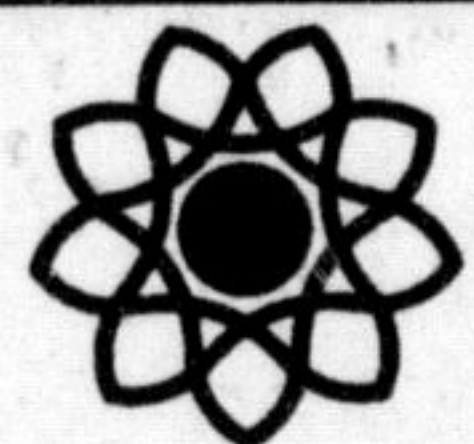
