

Nature camps for kids

Children can learn more about nature through Conservation Halton's Ways of the Woods summer day camp.

The camp at Mountsberg Wildlife Centre is available to children aged 8 to 12 years in four two-week and eight one-week sessions held during July and August.

Participants discover nature through a series of games and activities that empha-

size personal observations, listening skills, role playing, sharing and hands-on experiences. Pond explorations, insect hunts and bird hikes are a few examples.

Outdoor recreational activities such as archery, canoeing, caving and orienteering are also included.

The cost is \$135 per week. Bus transportation is included in the fee. For more information, call 854-2276.

Gori says the FCP often ignored by the big media

Halton Family Coalition Party (FCP) members gave Giuseppe Gori the nod once again to represent them in the next provincial election.

The only local FCP candidate seeking the nomination, Mr. Gori of Acton was acclaimed during a meeting at the Milton Optimist Centre April 15.

About 15 members attended the event to choose a candidate in the new Halton riding.

Mr. Gori said among many issues, the party is looking to reform education, ensure life from conception to natural death and reduce the GST over four years until the tax is eliminated.

He said the party also aims to remove regional government to pare down bureaucracy.

"The other parties have short-term vision," he said. "We have long-term vision."

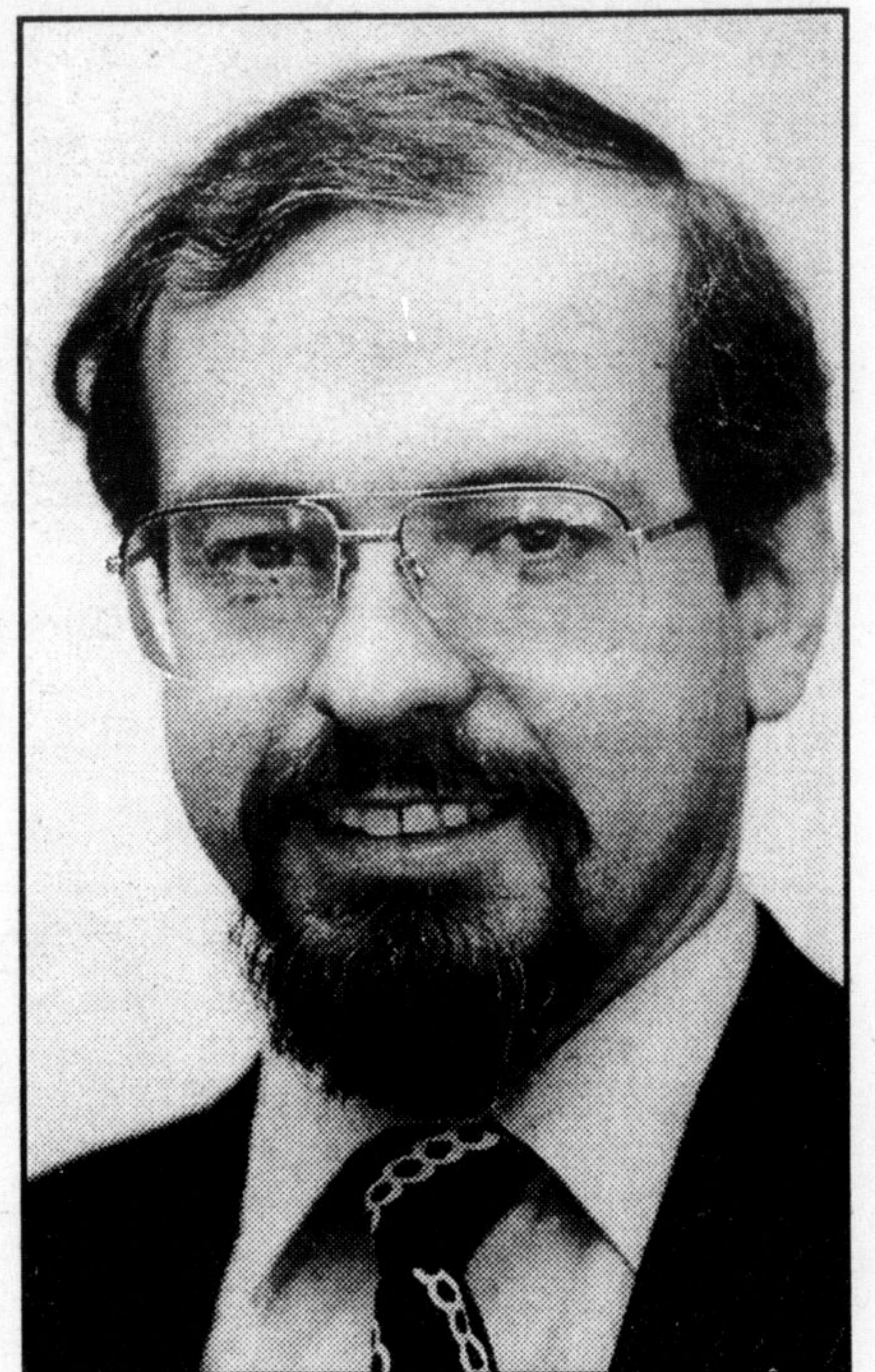
Another bone of contention, Mr. Gori said, is the role of the major media in elections.

He complained that smaller parties such as his don't receive equal coverage compared to the three main parties, and that goes against democracy.

"There are 11 registered parties in Ontario. The FCP is the fourth largest, potentially representing the views of 30 to 40 per cent of Ontarians," he said.

"However, after 11 years and running over 50 candidates in the last two elections, many people do not even know that we exist."

A computer consultant, Mr. Gori was first elected to run for the party locally in 1990. An election has yet to be called by the provincial Tories, but an announcement is expected soon.

erate with the authorities," he promised.

Police haven't released any details of an investigation involving Mr. Bourgon.

Mr. Hogan said the ICFC is equally eager for the report on the investigation to come to light.

"We are anxious to bring it to a conclusion from an investor client point of view," he said.

Once the report is in, the ICFC may consider launching a civil suit against Mr. Bourgon, said Mr. Hogan.

A civil suit would be means to recover missing money, should there be any.

Since the start of the investigation, Mr. Bourgon's accounts have been reassigned to other financial advisors.

The ICFC has been in touch with clients concerned about the drawn-out investigation, said Mr. Hogan.

"People in Milton have been patient and very understanding," he said.

In February, it was thought that a report would take as little as two weeks to a month to come in.
