Permit needed for yard fires

Firefighters hope a burning issue that continues to smolder — especially during the spring and summer months — can be doused with co-operation from the public.

As more people are burning on their properties at this time of year, the Milton Fire Department is asking the public to ensure they obtain a permit and follow through with the proper procedures.

While burning on urban properties is illegal, it's allowed at rural residences with a permit and phone calls reporting the start and finish of the burn to the fire department,


said Captain Mark Cross.

The phone calls ensure the department is aware of the burning and doesn't respond to false alarms called in when passersby mistake the smoke for an emergency — a scenario that comes to light on numerous occasions every year.

"It can be a big hazard for the public when vehicles are on the road going to something that's not an emergency," Captain Cross said.

A permit — good year-round — is free and can be obtained by filling out an application available at Central Station on Steeles Avenue.

The application process takes
