

# Hartholt puts on quite a show

Andrew Hartholt had a handful of reasons to smile at John Tonelli Sports Centre Friday.

The Jr. B Mavericks' captain scored five times, highlighting his offensive output with a natural hat-trick in the third period, to lead his charges past Wallaceburg 9-6.

He scored at even strength, he scored on the powerplay and he scored while shorthanded to deliver victory number one on the season.

Collectively, Milton put forth a fairly decent performance — particularly on defence, where they were much sharper than during home opening play against Elora.

That had a lot to do with the return of goaltender Andrew Dowdell and first-liner Graham Darling, who're both back from university.

The veteran cager turned aside 37 shots and was especially impressive when challenged downstairs. Meanwhile, Darling added that spark of defensive pressure that was sorely missing one week earlier.

"The guys moved the ball better and showed more intensity as well," said Mavericks' GM Dave Decaire.

Unfortunately, the evening's triumph ended on a sour note when Ian Parker short-circuited in the final few seconds of play and had to be restrained by his teammates.

The 20-year-old enforcer had just drawn a roughing minor and came unglued in the penalty box during a bout of trash talking by

both sides.

He was subsequently suspended five games — equivalent to one quarter of the regular season — by the Mavericks, who no doubt are growing tired of his recurrent outbursts.

Explained Decaire, "We felt we had to send a strong message, that we won't tolerate this type of behaviour."

Milton enjoyed 4-3 and 6-4 period leads on the way to victory. A rash of questionable penalties against them in the first and final frames allowed the visiting Red Devils to stay within striking distance.

Hartholt and Craig Hedley combined to minimize the damage of Wallaceburg's powerplay, that went 3-for-10, with some inspired backchecking.

Their biggest nemesis on the night was veteran Bill Taylor, who scored three times and added an assist.

Cory Leigh, who's set to challenge Hartholt for the team's scoring title this season, tallied twice. Back for another run with the Mavericks, Brent Moyer made his comeback Friday and contributed a second-period goal plus a pair of helpers.

Also scoring was Ryan Felix, a lefthanded shooter from Milton's Jr. A affiliate — the Orangeville Northmen.

**Maverick notes:** Jimmy Leworthy Jr. helped set up three goals against Wallaceburg and leads the team in assists with six ... Markham's Matt Chambers played his first game Friday and showed some defensive prowess ... Milton hosts Guelph this Friday at 8 p.m. Sunday they travel to Georgetown for a 7 p.m. clash.

# Lynch has earned save and a win so far

"My velocity has been good and my change-up's been very reliable," said Lynch, who earned a save in his Hagerstown debut on April 12 against Hickory and 10 days later beat Charleston for his first single A win. "I don't know where I'd be without it."

### Good natured

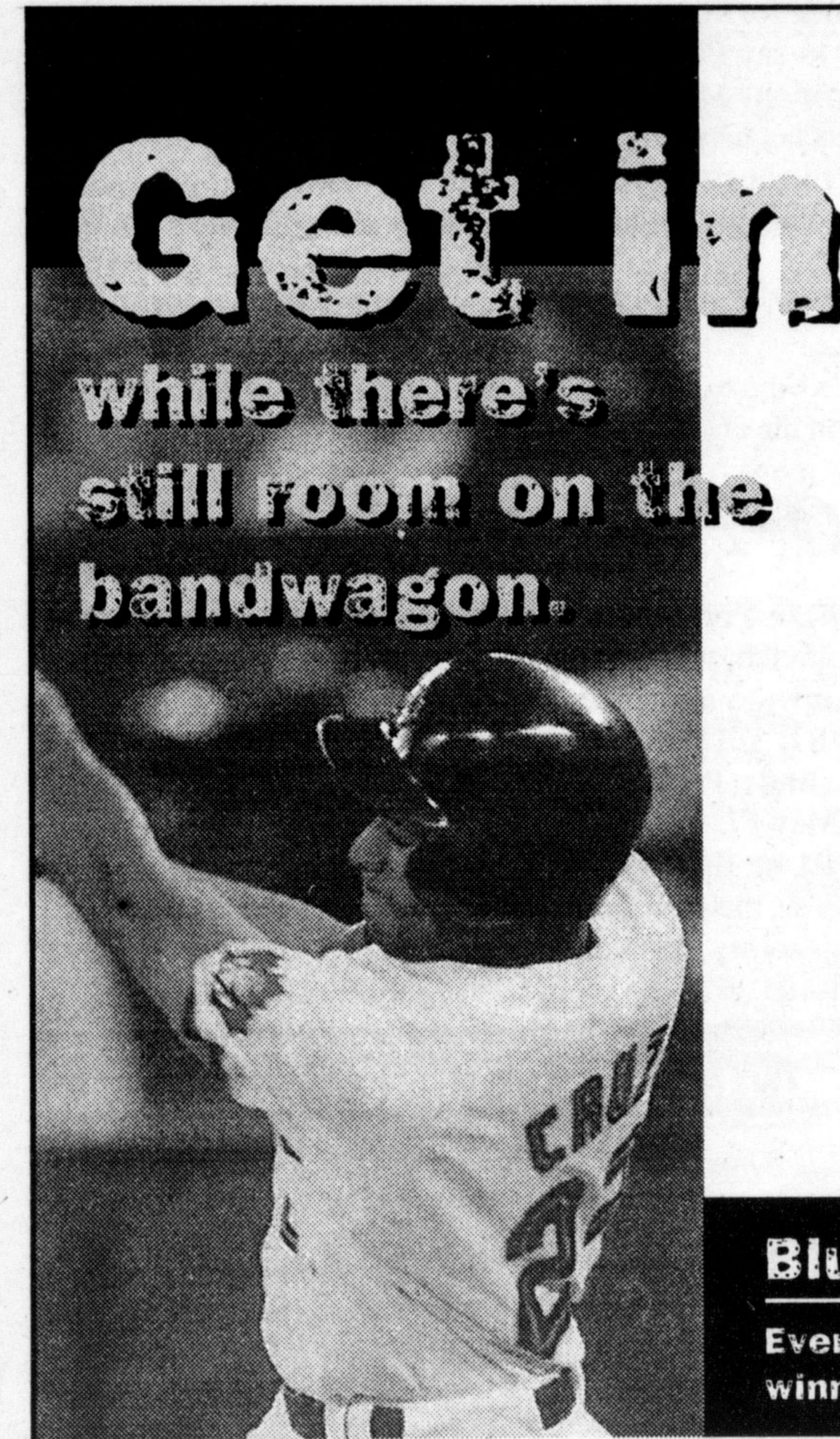
Since his early days in Milton minor baseball, Lynch has been described as a good-natured player with a genuine willingness to learn.

And although that's remained one of his greatest attributes over the years, he still finds it difficult to put one particular piece

of advice into practice — that of relying more on his defence.

"Coaches tell you that a lot, but when I get out there I'm always thinking about striking the guy out," Lynch admits. "It's nice to have strong defence behind you, but if you let them hit the ball too much eventually those shots turn into gappers and home runs."

He expects to a regular starter in the next few weeks, when the rotation is finally established. "Hopefully I'll make it onto Toronto's 40-man roster within two or three years," added Lynch.
