## Local ace sailor points bow toward Olympic goal in Athens

Stephanie Taylor is getting her feet wet in much larger waters these days.

Milton's ace sailor — who in recent years has medaled at both the Canada Summer Games and Canadian University Championships — has now ventured onto the global front, beginning a journey which she hopes will culminate with a berth in the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece.

Taylor took the first major step towards this lofty pursuit over the winter when she traveled to Melbourne, Australia and competed at the World Championships/Olympic Trials.

Laying the groundwork for future successes, and possibly an ultimate dream realized, she finished a respectable 17th in the bronze fleet of the Europe class (singlehanded boat) — the highest level for women's sailing.

"It's a whole different ball game in a place like Australia, it's so windy and wavy that just staying alive out there is kind of an accomplishment," quipped the 21-year-old, who just completed her first year at Queen's University. "I did pretty well for my first time out and Canada qualified for the 2000 Olympics, so overall it was a great experience."




