

Lynch wins another pair

May has been quite fruitful for Milton's Pat Lynch.

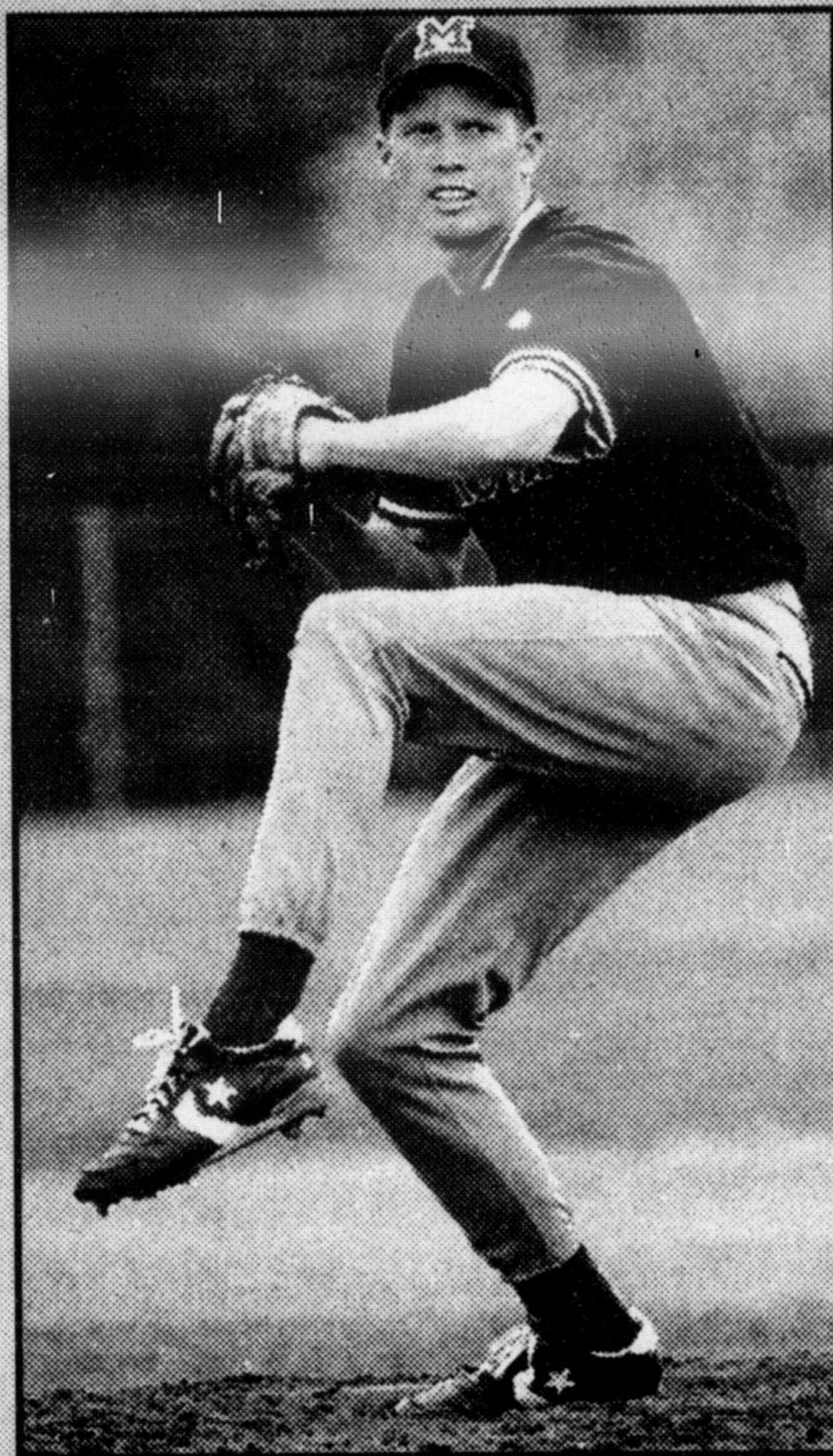
The Blue Jays' pitching prospect has already won two games this month with the single A Hagerstown Suns — including one last Saturday (May 8) against Delmarva.

He went six strong innings, giving up just a couple of earned runs on five hits en route to collecting his third victory of the season. Hagerstown scored an 8-2 decision on the day.

Lynch struck out a handful of batters and surrendered only one walk.

Five days later at Macon he worked five innings of relief in support of Hagerstown's 10-9 extra innings triumph. Lynch fanned eight this time around — an individual high for the year — and walked none.

Overall, the former Milton District Mustang star sits at 3-0 with an earned-run average of 2.67, third best on the team.

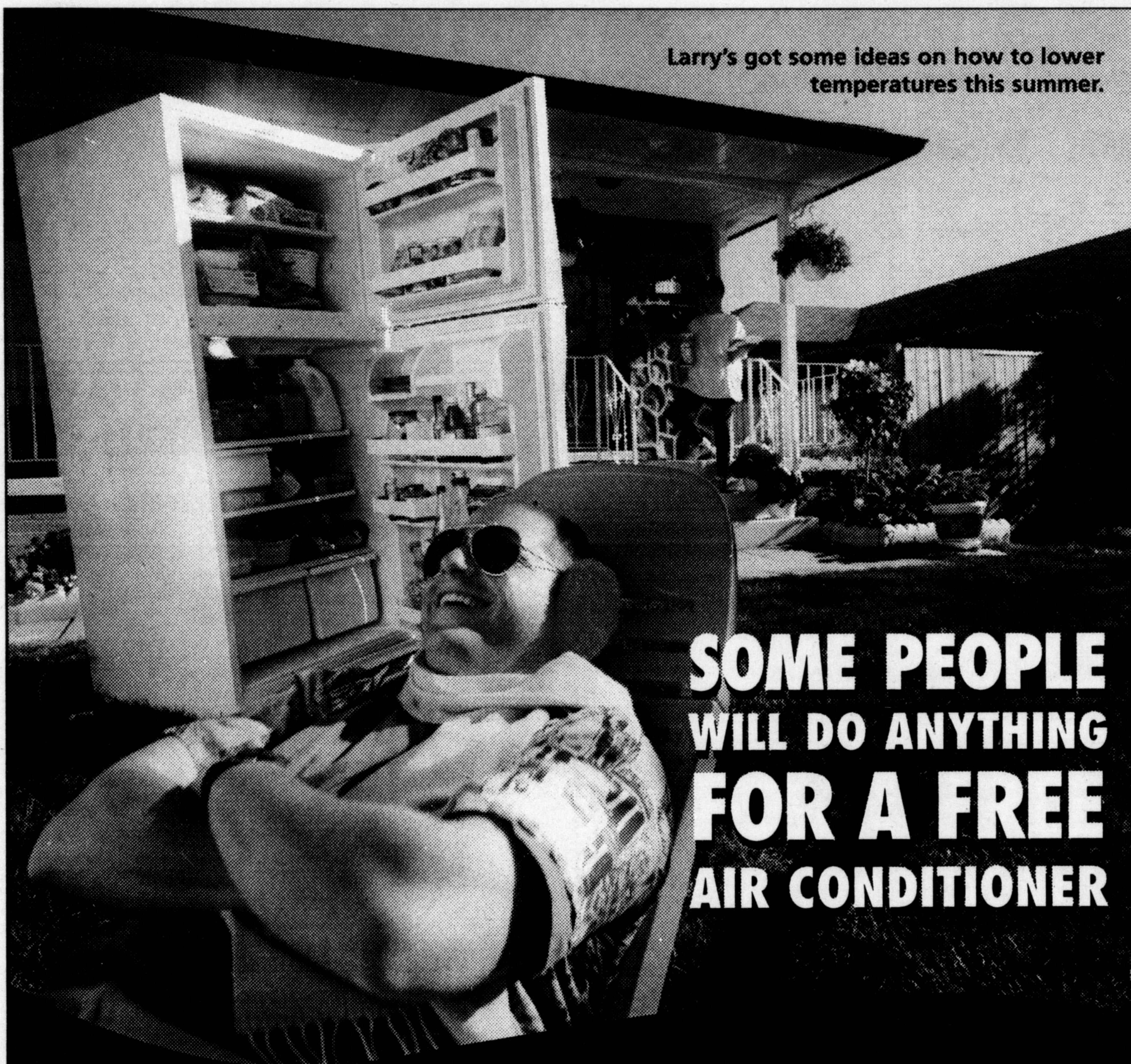
Showing strongly at the plate were Andrew Coe and Taylor Lawton, who each had a pair of hits.

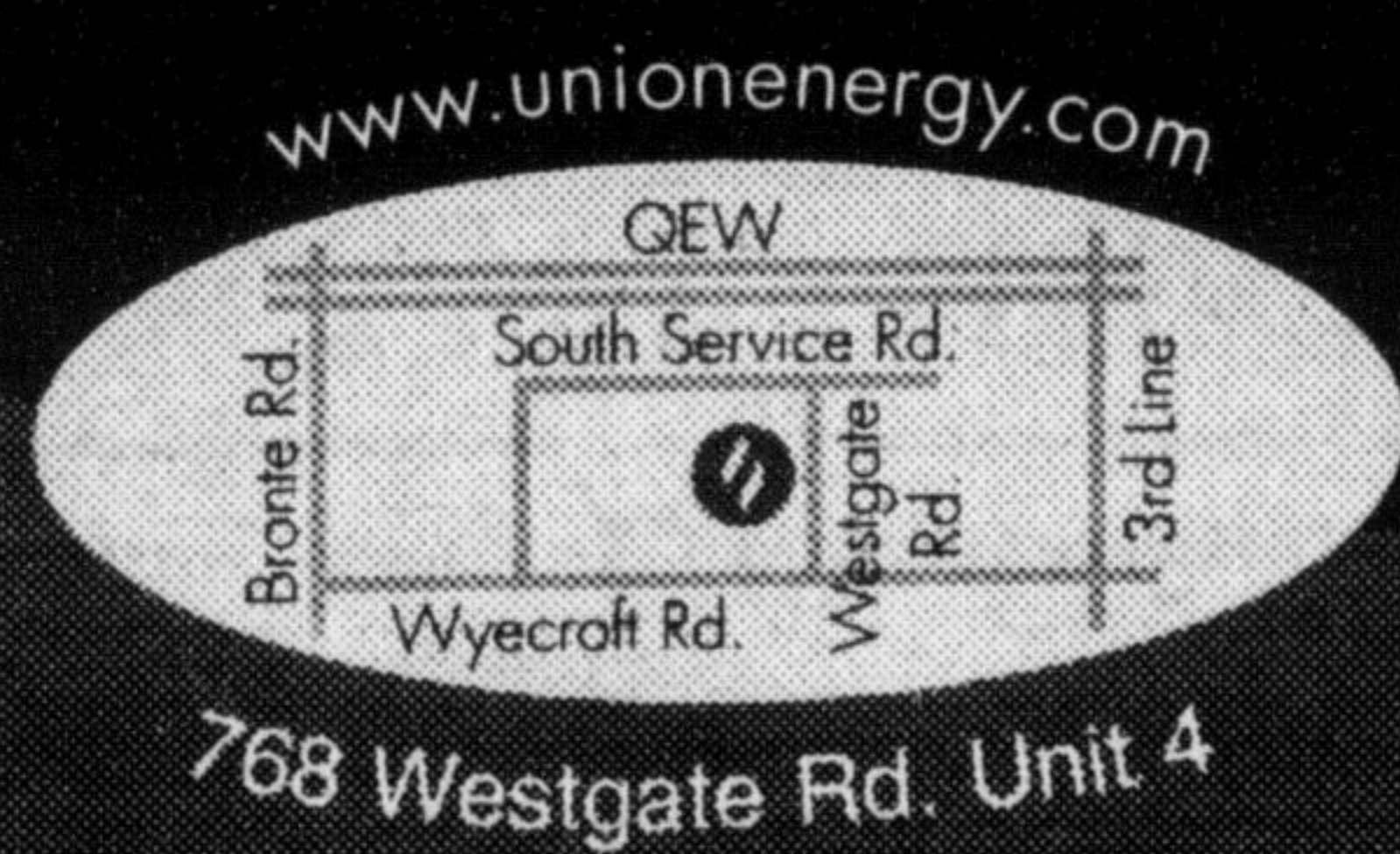
