

Milton's Shayne Ridley delivered a mini home run derby on Saturday to help Ball State University capture its first ever regular season league championship in the Mid-American Conference (MAC).

The Cardinals' junior shortstop belted a two-run shot in the first half of a doubleheader with Central Michigan to ignite a 4-3 comeback victory.

From there, he added a couple of solo dingers in game two to highlight an 8-3 win — which ensured BSU the title for the first time in its 35 year history.

The Cardinals were 40-16 overall and 25-6 in league play. They lost just one of their final 15 regular season contests and finished up on a four-game unbeaten


