

# Doell finishes in top 10

The future of local track and field is here — and its name is Michelle Doell.

Bishop Reding's ninth grader put the finishing touches on a sensational season this past weekend during the All-Ontario OFSAA Championships at Etobicoke Centennial Stadium.

An endurance racer with at least three more years of high school competition ahead of her, the 15-year-old placed in the top 10 at two events — establishing some intriguing possibilities for the near future.

"I'd actually hoped to do a little better at provincials, but on the whole I'm really happy with my efforts this spring," said Doell, who's also an accomplished cross-country runner. "Bigger and better performances are still to come. Next year will be very exciting."

Her best efforts came in the 800m Saturday morning when she trimmed three seconds off her personal best, clocking in at 2:21.06 and taking third in her heat.

later — Doell tacked those three seconds right back on and finished eighth overall. She was 11 seconds behind the winner, who nearly broke the meet record.

The Royals' lone representative wasn't quite at her best in the 1,500m and ended up ninth, in a particularly strong field.

In the more competitive of the two preliminary heats, Doell placed third with a time of 4:57.77 Thursday evening.

### Off her form

She had given just enough to secure advancement to the finals, looking to save as much energy as possible for the following night's big race.

Only then the local racer's best was not forthcoming as a 4:59.21 effort — roughly five seconds off her top individual time, set late last month during the Southern Regionals at Hamilton's McMaster University — was all she could muster.

"That really wasn't a great race for me," admitted Doell, who holds Bishop Reding Secondary School records in three distance events including the 400m, 800m and 1,500m. "But this year I was just happy to make it to OFSAA. Next year I'll be looking to really

The Georgetown Bulldogs are at a point now where they'd gladly accept a little charity — if it meant breaking out of a season-long losing skid.

Collectively they figured in eight goals and pulled the trigger on seven of those, with Leworthy Jr. notching an individual season high of four and Powless picking up the hat-trick.

Leworthy Jr. also delivered perhaps the most enter taining moment of the night when he squared off with Bulldog Jeff Newman. Each unloaded with several authoritative shots to the other in one of the fiercest fights this season.

Overall, north Halton's combatants were fairly aggressive and confrontational throughout the late


