A new program designed to reduce impaired driving will see participants get \$4 off their taxi fare when leaving local bars.

In the Last Call program, bar patrons who have been drinking will be given a \$4 coupon for a

home-bound cab ride. The coupon is funded by the bar (\$3) and Milton Taxi (\$1).

The program, just underway, was created and organized by Halton Regional Police Sgt. Brian Crosby, Waltzing Weasel owner Noel Farrell, and The Dickens operator Roger Mason.

Sgt. Crosby said a total of 14 Milton bars have agreed to take part.
