

Man is facing fraud charges

A 23-year-old Main Street man faces numerous charges for allegedly trying to purchase Chinese food with a stolen credit card.

A man ran into the men's washroom of China House after a police officer arrived at the Main Street restaurant June 17, Halton Regional Police said.

The officer retrieved the card from the washroom and arrested a man.

The suspect is charged with theft under \$5,000, possession of stolen property, using a stolen credit card and two counts of breach of probation.

said. One facility will be used by community groups while the other will stage major professional acts.

"This is a big improvement," said Mr. Scherer, who leads the event's 15-member committee and about 200 volunteers, mostly from local service clubs.

Another addition will be the introduction of Field and Fun Games. Participants enter a team of six to play old-fashioned fair games such as tug-of-war and wheelbarrow races.

A bigger selection of food will also be available this year, Ms Scherer said.

While the entertainment and other activities make for a fun celebration, the 11:30 a.m. dedication at the Victoria Park cenotaph is also an important part of the national holiday.

"We're looking to get more people out for the dedication at the cenotaph," Mr. Scherer said.

"We'd also like to see more people proceed with us in the walk to Rotary Park for the beginning of the festivities."

Working within a budget of just under \$10,000, the celebration is funded by the Town of Milton and with the help of public donations collected at the gate, he said.

Free Canada flags will be given to all patrons at the front entrance.
