Next Thursday Canada turns 132 years old, young as countries go, although given the pace of events in Europe over the past decade there are many much less senior.

But, especially at this time, there may not be many that offer as much promise as Canada. There's a lot to celebrate on July 1.

The economy is performing briskly, the nation has been at peace for two generations and the threat of break-up from Quebec has abated.

The Toronto Maple Leafs look like contenders again.

After wrenching changes through the late 1980s and into the middle of this decade, the country seems to be on track in terms of offering promise for those willing to work hard.

Though many would call it a less benevolent state, at least a path has been chosen and largely adhered to, and the cadence is in tune with much of the rest of the western world.

Canada remains a point of ethical reference for many other nations, in such areas as peacekeeping. The latest evidence of that came when Syria, earlier this week, asked for Canadian peacekeepers on the Golan Heights if and when negotiations with Israel over the strategically vital tract bear fruit.
