Taylor slams regional stance

does not pay for itself provincially but the line still exists in our official plan," said Oakville Councillor Kevin Flynn.

He asked if full cost recovery is still possible under the changed Act.

"The intent was that new growth would pay for itself," he said. "Is this saying that no matter how council decides, the provincial legislation will not allow for that?"

It is still Halton's goal to make growth as inexpensive as possible for current residents, said Halton's planning commissioner, Pat Murphy.

"One could argue that the Development Charges Act and our policy work together to minimize the impact," he said.

Exemptions in the Act tend to hit local municipalities the hardest, he added.

The Province will likely justify the new Act by noting that municipalities can recoup their money through property taxes, said Oakville Mayor Ann Mulvale.

"Their argument will say that we get it later rather than sooner," she said.

There may be an increased risk to taxpayers thanks to the Act, said Milton Mayor Gord Krantz.

"The message is the present property base should not have any negative impact," he said.

"But certainly the legislation is in place that it may have an impact."

Burlington Councillor John Taylor accused the

Region of having never meant what it said about full cost recovery growth.

"We didn't really mean that new growth will pay for itself. We only meant that residential growth will pay for itself," he charged. "I think the Region has done a relatively poor job in conveying that."

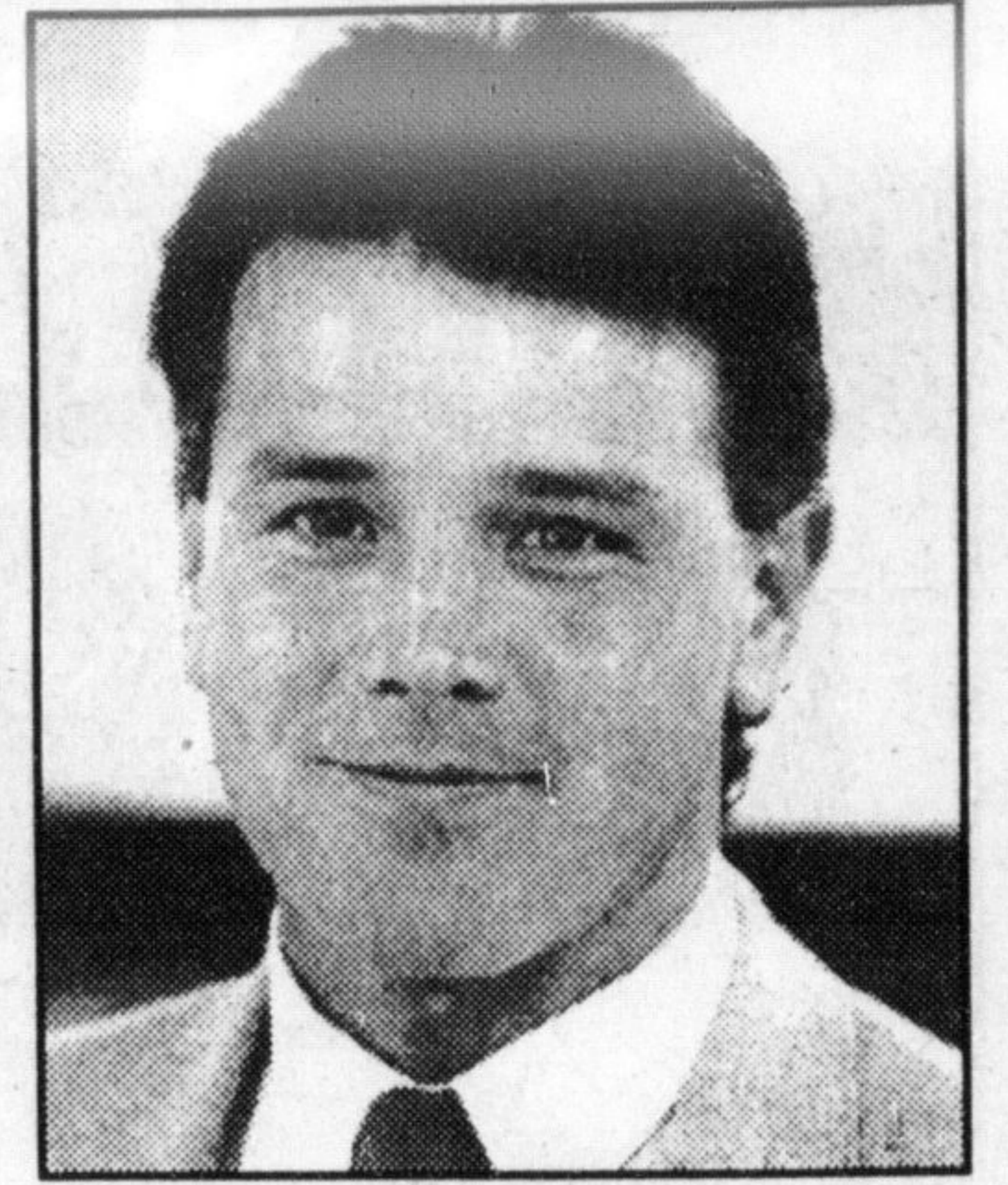
Mr. Taylor said he was shocked at the size of the discounts Halton is preparing to give to industrial and commercial growth.

Currently, Halton staff is recommending a residential development charge of \$6,171 per single family dwelling.

In order to stay competitive with neighboring municipalities, a 50 per cent discount is being proposed for industrial growth.

If approved, that would lower their charge from \$4.77 per square foot to \$2.39 per square foot.

A 25 per cent discount is proposed for commercial growth, bringing their charge down to \$3.58 per square foot.
