

It was a night of big returns for the Jr. B Mavericks Friday.

Craig Hedley made a grand comeback from his suspension, tallying twice and providing the backbone for an inspired defensive showing.

Meanwhile, Cory Leigh exploded with four goals to revisit the spotlight - which he'd frequented earlier in the year but grown somewhat unfamiliar with lately.

The pair's collective efforts led the 1999 Founder's Cup hosts to a 12-5 decision over Owen Sound.
