Classic cars will be displayed downtown

More than 250 classic cars will motor into downtown Friday, July 23.

The Classic Car Show 'N' Shine will return to the core to raise money for North Halton Community Living, which runs programs for developmentally handicapped adults and children.

About 3,000 patrons attended last year's show, said organizer Jim Brown.

"Those attending stated that it was one of the best shows they had ever been at," he said.

"In 1998, show cars had to be turned away. This year we expect an even larger turnout."

Last year, the Main Street show had visitors from as far away as New York state.

Show prizes and gifts for the event, organized in conjunction with the Milton Downtown Business Improvement Area, have been donated by local merchants.

Cow patty bingo and a 50/50 draw will also be held. The show will run from 6:30 to 11:30 p.m.

Milton is a central location in the region, said Milton Mayor Gord Krantz.

"It's not a north and south issue," he said. "Let's act in the best interests of the

seniors in Halton. That's the end of the story."

But Oakville Mayor Ann Mulvale argued that Milton beds are of little use to south Halton residents who don't have access to a car.

Cites wavering

"Mayor Krantz said to do the right thing for seniors," she said. "Which seniors?"

She asked council to return to an earlier plan to place beds where they are most needed.

"We have caused this to happen by wavering from that vision," she said.

Council should do that they can to bring more beds to Halton immediately, said Oakville Councillor Kevin Flynn.

"We have the opportunity to grasp a small part of the solution today," he said. "Why do we hold up the allocation to Martin House in hopes of something happening in the future that hasn't happened in the past?"
