Paul Macdonald rides a wave to eastern title

Paul Macdonald's wave of success continues.

The Milton barefoot water-skier won his second event of the year recently, capturing gold in the men's open class at the Eastern Canadian Championships in Cambridge.

Overall victory — which no doubt lifted his national ranking to a top five position — was secured through consistent and captivating performances over the twoday showcase.

The 23-year-old got progressively stronger as the weekend wore on and punctuated his efforts with a huge exclamation mark, finishing first in the trick event with a score of 2,130 on the Sunday evening.


Incorporating nine exciting elements into his routine - the most troublesome of which was the toe turn where he grips the handle with one foot and then rides on the other before spinning backwards, all without using his hands — he outscored the runner-up by 400 points.

"I closed out with the toe turn and really nailed it this time," said Macdonald, who won the eastern nationals after playing the role of bridesmaid with second and third place finishes the previous three years.

The Eastern Canadian champ tied for first in the jump-off, clearing 41 feet on his first attempt and coming up just one foot shy of a personal record.

Explained Macdonald, "I went a little further on the

next two tries but couldn't stick the landing. For a jump to count, you have to be able to ski away with control."


In Saturday's slalom event — which represents the racing portion of the showcase — the local water walker made 9.4 crossings during the two allotted 15second passes.

This solid but unspectacular effort, due in part to especially choppy waters that morning, placed him third with two full crossings less than the winner.

In the all-around standings, he upstaged local favourite John Trip (who trains on the Grand River) for the gold medal.

"It was definitely nice to win and see all my hard work pay off," said Macdonald, who receives sponsorship from Bolle Canada and Eagle Wet Suits.

He'll try to parlay this recent victory into greater riches early next month at the Canadian Championships, which will be held in Kamloops, British Columbia.


