"We've smoked Martin Grove all year and beaten Erindale two of three times," said manager Larry Black. "Unless we really fall apart, we should go on to Sault Ste. Marie."

The team currently sits at 22-13 overall this season, which includes a final regular season standing of 12-7 — that was good enough for fourth place in the Central Ontario Baseball Association.


