### TIP OF THE MONTH

## Lots of pot to go up in smoke after raid of 15 hidden crops

Police say they've taken \$1.5 million from the pockets of pot producers after seizing more than 1,500 pounds of marijuana and arresting two people last week.

In an intense two-day, helicopter-assisted drug crackdown, police sniffed out a total of 15 marijuana crops growing in rural Halton.

Seven of the sites were discovered in Milton while the others were found in Burlington and Halton Hills.

The biggest bust, at Sixth Line and Derry Road Wednesday, ended with two arrests near a field in which police say pot growers had set up camp to tend their soon-to-be harvested \$400,000 crop.

Fencing and rat poison to deter animals from indulging in the bumper crop were found at the scene.

"We've ruined these people," said Det. Bruce Mitchell of the drug and morality

bureau. "This would have been their livelihood."

A 24-year-old Hamilton man and 25-year-old Mississauga man were arrested after a jogger pointed police in the direction of two people running from a field as the helicopter hovered overhead. The suspects face drug and weapons charges.

Police are crediting the use of the newly-purchased chopper as well as the help of officers from Waterloo Regional Police and the Goderich OPP for the crackdown's success.

Experts in locating marijuana crops from the air, the officers showed Halton police how to spot the pot — only detectable by a trained eye.

"The helicopter easily spotted the grow-

## Cops say 'stupidity' caused 401 car crash

The OPP says "stupidity on the road" Saturday is to blame for a serious Hwy. 401 crash in which two Brampton men face criminal charges.

Witnesses to the 4 p.m. crash on the eastbound lanes near Kelso Lake told police a red Chevrolet Camaro and a black BMW were speeding and cutting in and out of traffic just before the Camaro collided with a Suzuki in the left lane.

Both vehicles spun out of control and struck the centre median. The Suzuki then rolled over several times, coming to a rest on its roof.
