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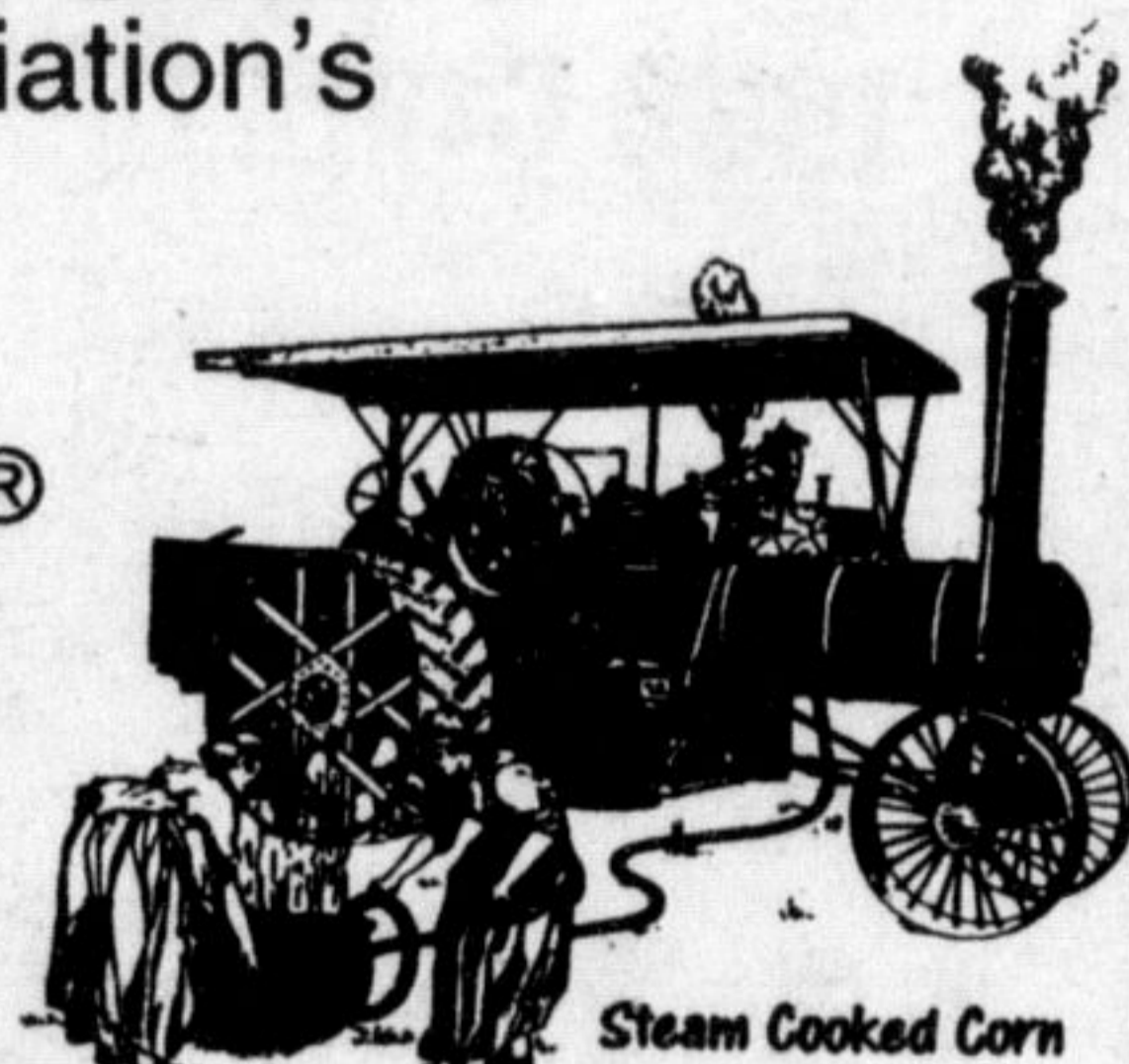

The eastbound lanes were closed for about half an hour while firefighters and ambulance attendants from Milton and Guelph worked to remove the two occupants of the Suzuki.

Drive Jeanette Cossier, 20, of Woodstock was transported to Milton District Hospital while passenger Ron Nadalin, also of Woodstock was taken to Guelph General Hospital. Both were treated and released.

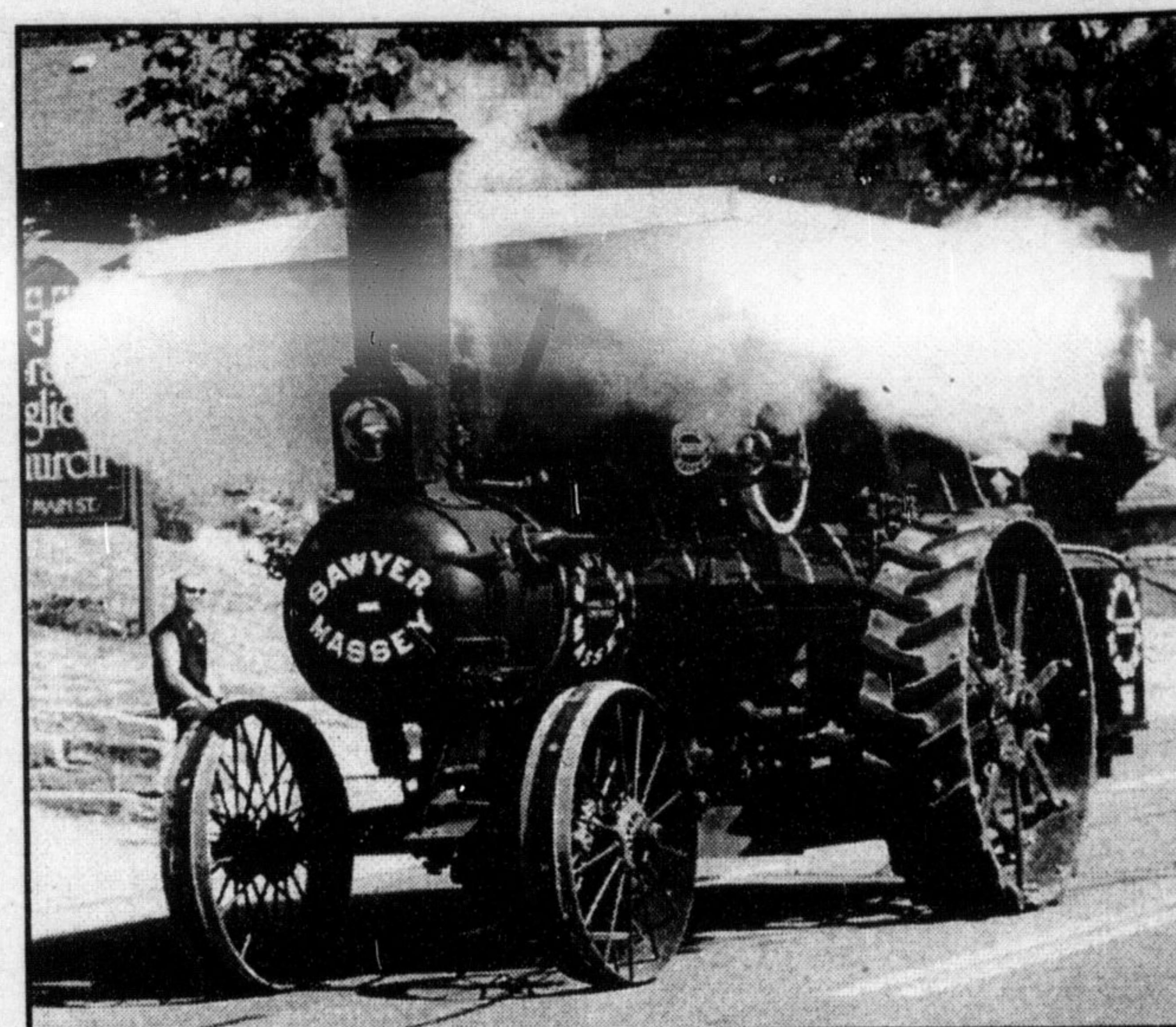
Eastbound traffic was then restricted to one lane for three hours while the Cambridge OPP conducted a thorough examination of the scene.

Brijinder Pal Singh Bhullar, 31, of Brampton was arrested at the scene. He faces charges of dangerous driving causing bodily harm and impaired driving causing bodily harm. He was released and is scheduled to appear in Ontario Court (provincial division) in Milton September 20.

With the aid of witnesses, investigators located the BMW last night, said OPP Constable Rob Kobayashi, who called the accident the "result of stupidity on the road."

The constable said the two suspects, who are cousins, were allegedly racing on the highway.

## Full steam ahead for the last show of the millenium

A part of Milton's past will come chugging into the present for the upcoming Steam-Era '99.

A dozen or more steam engines, about 200 tractors and scores of antique cars and trucks will pull into Milton Fair Grounds Labour Day weekend, September 3-6.

John Deere is the feature manufacturer of the year.

Enthusiasts from all over Ontario and parts of the United States are expected to turn out for the exhibition, which has grown to be one of the largest in Canada.

But at one time, it was possible that the impressive looking machines would be lost forever.

"Back in the '60's there was a great concern that if people didn't start preserving the old machines there wouldn't be any of them left," said Brad Clements, publicity director for Steam-Era. "They'd be concerned that this stuff was rusting and then going off to the scrap yard."

Instead, the past is celebrated as the lovingly restored machines roar into action at the 39th annual exhibition.

Twice daily, the big beasts parade around the quarter mile track at the Fair Grounds.

They also take part in antique tractor pulls, threshing competitions and saw and shingle mill demonstrations.

"That you can't see in a museum," pointed out Mr. Clements.
